6 Remove everything after the enacting clause and insert:

7 Section 1. Subsections (4) and (5) of section 286.29,  
 8 Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

9 286.29 Climate-friendly public business.—The Legislature  
 10 recognizes the importance of leadership by state government in  
 11 the area of energy efficiency and in reducing the greenhouse gas  
 12 emissions of state government operations. The following shall  
 13 pertain to all state agencies when conducting public business:

14 (4) When procuring new vehicles, all state agencies, state  
 15 universities, community colleges, and local governments that  
 16 purchase vehicles under a state purchasing plan shall first

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17 | define the intended purpose for the vehicle and determine which  
18 | of the following use classes for which the vehicle is being  
19 | procured:

- 20 | (a) State business travel, designated operator;
- 21 | (b) State business travel, pool operators;
- 22 | (c) Construction, agricultural, or maintenance work;
- 23 | (d) Conveyance of passengers;
- 24 | (e) Conveyance of building or maintenance materials and  
25 | supplies;
- 26 | (f) Off-road vehicle, motorcycle, or all-terrain vehicle;
- 27 | (g) Emergency response; or
- 28 | (h) Other.

30 | Vehicles described in paragraphs (a) through (h), when being  
31 | processed for purchase or leasing agreements, must be selected  
32 | based on the lowest lifetime ownership costs over 5 years as  
33 | determined by the Department of Management Services. On an  
34 | annual basis, the department shall rank vehicles based on the  
35 | lowest cost of ownership over 5 years using available industry  
36 | data and publish the rankings on the department's website. Any  
37 | vehicle that is a sedan or a light truck and is purchased under  
38 | a state purchasing plan must be ranked in the top 5 of the  
39 | department's rankings unless an exception is approved by the  
40 | secretary of the department and the secretary states the reason  
41 | for the exception. Law enforcement vehicles are exempt from the

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42 ~~top 5 ranking requirement for the greatest fuel efficiency~~  
43 ~~available for a given use class when fuel economy data are~~  
44 ~~available. Exceptions may be made for individual vehicles in~~  
45 ~~paragraph (g) when accompanied, during the procurement process,~~  
46 ~~by documentation indicating that the operator or operators will~~  
47 ~~exclusively be emergency first responders or have special~~  
48 ~~documented need for exceptional vehicle performance~~  
49 ~~characteristics. Any request for an exception must be approved~~

53 ~~(5) All state agencies shall use ethanol and biodiesel~~

58 Section 2. Before July 1, 2023, the Department of  
59 Management Services shall make recommendations to state  
60 agencies, including state colleges and universities, and local  
61 governments regarding the procurement of electric and natural  
62 gas fuel vehicles and best practices for integrating such  
63 vehicles into existing fleets.

64 Section 3. Paragraph (p) of subsection (1) of section  
65 553.791, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

66 553.791 Alternative plans review and inspection.—

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67 (1) As used in this section, the term:  
68 (p) "Single-trade inspection" means any inspection focused  
69 on a single construction trade, such as plumbing, mechanical, or  
70 electrical. The term includes, but is not limited to,  
71 inspections of door or window replacements; fences and block  
72 walls more than 6 feet high from the top of the wall to the  
73 bottom of the footing; stucco or plastering; reroofing with no  
74 structural alteration; HVAC replacements; installation of  
75 electric vehicle charging stations; solar energy and energy  
76 storage installations or alterations; ductwork or fan  
77 replacements; alteration or installation of wiring, lighting,  
78 and service panels; water heater changeouts; sink replacements;  
79 and repiping.

80 Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2022.

84 Remove everything before the enacting clause and insert:  
85 An act relating to energy; amending s. 286.29, F.S.; revising  
86 the selection criteria for purchasing or leasing vehicles for  
87 state agency, college, or university or certain local government  
88 fleets; requiring the Department of Management Services, using  
89 available industry data, to rank certain vehicles based on the  
90 lowest lifetime ownership costs over a specified number of  
91 years, rather than fuel efficiency, and to publish the rankings

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92 | to the department's website; requiring that certain vehicles  
93 | purchased under a state purchasing plan be ranked at a  
94 | specified level unless an exception is approved by the  
95 | department secretary; exempting law enforcement vehicles from  
96 | the ranking requirement; removing a provision requiring the use  
97 | and procurement of ethanol and biodiesel fuels; requiring the  
98 | department, before a specified date, to make recommendations to  
99 | state agencies and local governments relating to the procurement  
100 | and integration of electric and natural gas fuel vehicles;  
101 | amending s. 553.791, F.S.; revising the definition of the term  
102 | "single-trade inspection"; providing an effective date.
