19	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

21	Section 1. Subsections (7) and (8) of section 465.014,
22	Florida Statutes, are renumbered as subsections (8) and (9),
23	respectively, and a new subsection (7) is added to that section,
24	to read:
25	465.014 Pharmacy technician
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26	(7) A registered pharmacy technician seeking to administer
27	vaccines under s. 465.189 must be certified to administer such
28	vaccines pursuant to a certification program approved by the
29	board in consultation with the Board of Medicine and the Board
30	of Osteopathic Medicine. The certification program must have at
31	least 6 hours of immunization-related training approved by the
32	board that shall, at a minimum, have curriculum of instruction
33	concerning the safe and effective administration of such
34	vaccines, including, but not limited to, potential allergic
35	reactions to such vaccines. As a condition of registration
36	renewal, a registered pharmacy technician seeking to administer
37	vaccines under s. 465.189 must have at least 2 hours of
38	continuing education approved by the board in addition to the
39	biennial continuing education required in subsection (6).
40	Section 2. Subsections (1), (4), (5), and (7) of section
41	465.189, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:
42	465.189 Administration of vaccines and epinephrine
43	autoinjection
44	(1) In accordance with guidelines of the Centers for
45	Disease Control and Prevention for each recommended immunization
46	or vaccine, a pharmacist who is certified under subsection (7)
47	or a registered intern <u>or a registered pharmacy technician</u> under
48	the supervision of <u>such</u> a pharmacist, who is certified under
49	subsection (7) may administer the following immunizations or
50	vaccines to an adult within the framework of an established
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51 protocol under a supervising physician licensed under chapter 52 458 or chapter 459:

(a) Immunizations or vaccines listed in the Adult
Immunization Schedule as of <u>March 31, 2022</u> April 30, 2021, by
the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.
The board may authorize by rule additional immunizations or
vaccines as they are added to the Adult Immunization Schedule.

(b) Immunizations or vaccines recommended by the United
States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention for
international travel as of <u>March 31, 2022</u> April 30, 2021. The
board may authorize by rule additional immunizations or vaccines
as they are recommended by the United States Centers for Disease
Control and Prevention for international travel.

(c) Immunizations or vaccines licensed for use in the
United States, or which have been authorized for emergency use,
by the United States Food and Drug Administration as of <u>March</u>
<u>31, 2022</u> April 30, 2021. The board may authorize by rule
additional immunizations or vaccines as they are so licensed or
authorized.

70 (d) Immunizations or vaccines approved by the board in 71 response to a state of emergency declared by the Governor 72 pursuant to s. 252.36.

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74 A registered intern <u>or registered pharmacy technician</u> who 75 administers an immunization or vaccine under this subsection

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76 must be supervised by a certified pharmacist at a ratio of one 77 pharmacist to <u>a maximum of five</u> <del>one</del> registered <u>interns or</u> 78 <u>registered pharmacy technicians</u>, or a combination thereof 79 <del>intern</del>.

(4) A pharmacist may not enter into a protocol <u>under a</u>
<u>supervising physician licensed under chapter 458 or chapter 459</u>
<u>or administer an immunization or vaccine under this section</u>
unless he or she maintains at least \$200,000 of professional
liability insurance and has completed training in administering
vaccines authorized under this section.

86 (5) A pharmacist administering <u>immunizations or</u> vaccines 87 under this section shall maintain and make available patient 88 records using the same standards for confidentiality and 89 maintenance of such records as those that are imposed on health 90 care practitioners under s. 456.057. These records shall be 91 maintained for a minimum of 5 years.

Any pharmacist, or registered intern, or registered 92 (7) 93 pharmacy technician seeking to administer vaccines under this 94 section must be certified to administer such vaccines pursuant to a certification program approved by the board of Pharmacy in 95 consultation with the Board of Medicine and the Board of 96 97 Osteopathic Medicine. The certification program shall, at a 98 minimum, require that the pharmacist attend at least 20 hours of 99 continuing education classes approved by the board and the registered intern complete at least 20 hours of coursework 100

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101	approved by the board. The registered pharmacy technician shall
102	have immunization-related training and continuing education as
103	provided in s. 465.014. The certification programs program
104	shall, at a minimum, have a curriculum of instruction concerning
105	the safe and effective administration of such vaccines,
106	including, but not limited to, potential allergic reactions to
107	such vaccines.
108	Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2022.

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
