20	process of students. Included in the classification of
21	instructional personnel are the following prekindergarten

24	members assigned the professional activity of instructing

27	and adult education, including substitute teachers. Included in
28	this classification are prekindergarten instructors funded in
29	the Florida Education Finance Program who hold an educator

31	Education, Early Childhood Education, or any exceptional student
32	education area with the Prekindergarten Disabilities
33	endorsement.
34	(b) Student personnel servicesStudent personnel services
35	include staff members responsible for: advising students with
36	regard to their abilities and aptitudes, educational and
37	occupational opportunities, and personal and social adjustments;
38	providing placement services; performing educational
39	evaluations; and similar functions. Included in this
40	classification are certified school counselors, social workers,
41	career specialists, and school psychologists.
42	(c) Librarians/media specialistsLibrarians/media
43	specialists are staff members responsible for providing school
44	library media services. These employees are responsible for
45	evaluating, selecting, organizing, and managing media and
46	technology resources, equipment, and related systems;
47	facilitating access to information resources beyond the school;

(d) Other instructional staff.—Other instructional staff are staff members who are part of the instructional staff but are not classified in one of the categories specified in paragraphs (a)-(c). Included in this classification are primary specialists, learning resource specialists, instructional trainers, adjunct educators certified pursuant to s. 1012.57, and similar positions.

59 (e) Education paraprofessionals.-Education paraprofessionals are individuals who are under the direct 60 61 supervision of an instructional staff member, aiding the 62 instructional process. Included in this classification are 63 classroom paraprofessionals in regular instruction, exceptional 64 education paraprofessionals, career education paraprofessionals, 65 adult education paraprofessionals, library paraprofessionals, 66 physical education and playground paraprofessionals, and other school-level paraprofessionals. 67
