Amendment (with title amendment)

Remove everything after the enacting clause and insert: Section 1. Section 415.1104, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

415.1104 Elder abuse fatality review teams; public record and public meeting exemptions.-

10 (1) (a) Any information that is confidential or exempt from 11 s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution and 12 is obtained by an elder abuse fatality review team pursuant to 13 s. 415.1103 retains its confidential or exempt status. 14 (b) Any information contained in a record held by an elder 15 abuse fatality review team which reveals the identity of a 16 victim of elder abuse and the address or location of such

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17	victim's residence; the identity of a person providing direct
18	care to the victim and the address or location of such person's
19	residence; and the identity of any person reporting abuse,
20	neglect, or exploitation to the central abuse hotline is
21	confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I

23	(2) Any portion of a meeting of an elder abuse fatality
24	review team during which information made confidential or exempt
25	pursuant to subsection (1) is discussed is exempt from s.
26	286.011 and s. 24(b), Art. I of the State Constitution.
27	(3) This section is subject to the Open Government Sunset
28	Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand repealed
29	on October 2, 2027, unless reviewed and saved from repeal
30	through reenactment by the Legislature.
31	Section 2. The Legislature finds that it is a public
32	necessity that information that is confidential or exempt from
33	s. 119.07(1), Florida Statutes, and s. 24(a), Article I of the
34	State Constitution remain confidential or exempt when held by an
35	elder abuse fatality review team and that any information
36	contained in a record held by an elder abuse fatality review
37	team which reveals the identity of a victim of elder abuse and
38	the address or location of such victim's residence; the identity
39	of a person providing direct care to the victim and the address
40	or location of such person's residence; and the identity of any
41	person reporting abuse, neglect, or exploitation to the central
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42	abuse hotline, be made confidential and exempt from public	
43	records requirements. Without the public record exemption,	
44	sensitive personal information concerning victims of elder abuse	
45	and persons providing direct care to such victims, as well as	
46	persons reporting abuse, neglect, or exploitation to the central	
47	abuse hotline, would be subject to public disclosure and open	
48	communication and coordination among the parties involved in	
49	elder abuse fatality review teams would be hampered. The	
50	Legislature further finds that it is a public necessity that any	
51	portion of a meeting of an elder abuse fatality review team	
52	during which confidential or exempt information is discussed be	
53	made exempt from s. 286.011, Florida Statutes, and s. 24(b),	
54	Article I of the State Constitution. The failure to close	
55	portions of meetings during which confidential or exempt	
56	information is discussed would defeat the purpose of the public	
57	records exemption and would have a chilling effect on the	
58	ability of the task force members to discuss the information the	
59	members have been tasked with reviewing and analyzing. As such,	
60	the Legislature finds that without the exemptions from public	
61	record and public meeting requirements, the elder abuse fatality	
62	review teams would be unable to operate in an effective and	
63	efficient manner.	
64	Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2022.

70	s. 415.1104, F.S.; specifying that information obtained by an
71	elder abuse fatality review team which is confidential or exempt
72	from public records requirements retains its protected status;
73	providing an exemption from public records requirements for
74	personal identifying information of an elder abuse victim and
75	other specified information contained in records held by a
76	review team; providing an exemption from public meetings
77	requirements for portions of review team meetings during which
78	confidential or exempt information is discussed; providing for
79	future legislative review and repeal; providing statements of
80	public necessity; providing an effective date.

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
