- (c) An early learning coalition shall apply the following priority order for students in awarding scholarships, beginning with the highest priority:
  - 1. Students who are in foster care.

- 2. Students who are infants or toddlers with a current individualized family service plan.
- 3. Students who have a parent younger than 21 years of age who is pursuing a high school or high school equivalency diploma.
- 4. Students who are experiencing or have experienced homelessness or who fall within the category "children known to the department" as defined in s. 39.0016(1).
- 5. Students who have a household income that does not exceed 185 percent of the federal poverty level.
  - 6. Students on the direct certification list.
- 7. Subject to the appropriation of general revenue funds
  by the Legislature, students who have a household income above

  185 percent but not exceeding 300 percent of the federal poverty

  level.
  - (d) An early learning coalition may prioritize

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applications on the basis of additional factors, including geographic location and whether the student's family is currently enrolled in, or on a waiting list for, a publicly funded program that provides early education or child care services.

- (e) The division shall establish criteria for early learning coalitions to use when determining the amount of scholarship awards. The total amount of a scholarship award, or the amount of a scholarship award in combination with any other public funds received to provide early education or child care services for the student, may not exceed the program provider's published private pay rate. Scholarship funds may not be used to supplant any federal funding received by the program to provide services for the student.
- (f) The division shall report on program implementation and progress as part of its annual reporting requirements under s. 1002.82(7). The report must include, at a minimum, information on the number, ages, and priority levels of children served and the total number and the total dollar amount of scholarships awarded by priority level.
- (g) The division shall contract with an independent contractor to evaluate the program. The evaluation must include recommendations regarding the appropriate scholarship amount, the efficiency and effectiveness of program administration, and the impact on kindergarten readiness. By January 15, 2025, the
