

26 (a) The location in the hospital where the unidentified
27 person is admitted or being treated.

28 (b) The type of injury suffered by the unidentified
29 person.

30 (c) A description of the unidentified person's condition,
31 using general terms that do not disclose specific medical
32 information about the person.

33 (d) A description of distinguishing physical
34 characteristics of the unidentified person, including height,
35 weight, gender, race, hair and eye color, and any facial hair,
36 scars, and tattoos.

37 (2) Before entering any information into the directory, a
38 hospital shall first inform the unidentified person that his or
39 her personal identifying information will be included in the
40 directory and may be disclosed to the public upon request. The
41 hospital shall provide the unidentified person with the
42 opportunity to restrict or prohibit the inclusion in the
43 directory of any of the information specified in subsection (1)
44 or the disclosure of such information. If an unidentified person
45 cannot reasonably be informed of inclusion in the directory due
46 to the person's incapacitation or emergency treatment protocols,
47 the hospital must include the unidentified person in the
48 directory until the unidentified person is no longer
49 incapacitated or the emergency has subsided, at which point the
50 hospital must inform the unidentified person of his or her

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51 | inclusion in the directory and the option to restrict or
52 | prohibit continued inclusion or the disclosure of his or her
53 | personal identifying information.

54 | Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2022.
