necessity that a petition filed under s. 943.0583, Florida Statutes, and all pleadings and documents related to the petition be made confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1), Florida Statutes, and s. 24(a), Article I of the State Constitution. Persons who are victims of human trafficking and who have been arrested for offenses committed, or reported to have been committed, as a result of being trafficked are themselves victims of crimes. These victims face barriers to employment and loss of other life opportunities, and the fact that the victims are seeking expungement, as well as the information contained in related pleadings and documents, would expose these victims to possible discrimination due to details of their past lives becoming public knowledge. Therefore, it is necessary that these petitions, pleadings, and related documents be made confidential in order for human trafficking victims to have the chance to rebuild their lives and reenter society. Section 3. This act shall take effect on the same date that HB 1439 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law.
