10	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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12	Section 1. Subsection (3) of section 110.12301, Florida
13	Statutes, is amended to read:
14	110.12301 Competitive procurement of postpayment claims
15	review services and dependent eligibility verification services;
16	public records exemption
17	(3) Records collected for purposes of dependent
18	eligibility verification services conducted for the state group
19	insurance program, as authorized under subsection (2), and held
20	by the department are confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1)
21	and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. This subsection
22	does not apply to records that are otherwise open for inspection
23	and copying which are held by the department for purposes other
24	than for the performance of dependent eligibility verification
25	services. This subsection is subject to the Open Government

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26 Sunset Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand 27 repealed on October 2, <u>2027</u> 2022, unless reviewed and saved from 28 repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.

29 Section 2. (1) The Legislature finds that it is a public 30 necessity that records collected for the purpose of dependent eligibility verification services conducted for the state group 31 32 insurance program, as authorized under s. 110.12301(2), Florida 33 Statutes, pursuant to the amendments made by this act, and held 34 by the Department of Management Services be made confidential 35 and exempt from s. 119.07(1), Florida Statutes, and s. 24(a), Article I of the State Constitution. The existing public records 36 37 exemption is expanded to include additional records that employees may submit under additional specified eligibility 38 39 categories as part of the existing dependent eligibility 40 verification process. Such records include records relating to 41 guardianship of a child, the fostering of a child, unmarried 42 adult children, and disabled adult children, which include court 43 orders, foster care records, birth certificates, adoption 44 certificates, student academic and financial records, medical 45 records, and transcripts of filed tax returns. Like other 46 records collected and held by the Department of Management 47 Services for dependent eligibility verification, these records 48 should be protected from public disclosure, as they contain 49 sensitive and personal information that may deter employees from 50 producing them in the absence of the same protections offered in

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51	connection with the current eligibility categories. If the
52	public had unfettered access to the information contained within
53	these records, employees and their family members could be
54	placed at increased risk of identity theft and fraud.
55	(2) The Legislature further recognizes that this exemption
56	is narrowly tailored and applies only to those records collected
57	for the purpose of verifying eligible dependents for enrollment
58	in the state group insurance program.
59	Section 3. This act shall take effect on the same date
60	that HB 1443 or similar legislation takes effect, if such
61	legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an
62	extension thereof and becomes a law.

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
