7 (d) School library media services; establishment and
 8 maintenance.—Establish and maintain a program of school library
 9 media services for all public schools in the district, including
 10 school library media centers, or school library media centers
 11 open to the public, and, in addition such traveling or
 12 circulating libraries as may be needed for the proper operation
 13 of the district school system. ~~Each school district shall~~
 14 ~~provide training to~~ School librarians, and media specialists, and
 15 and other personnel involved in the selection of school district
 16 library materials must complete the training program developed

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17 pursuant to s. 1006.29(5) before reviewing and selecting
18 ~~regarding the prohibition against distributing harmful materials~~
19 ~~to minors under s. 847.012 and applicable case law, and best~~
20 ~~practices for providing students access to age-appropriate~~
21 materials and library resources. Upon written request, a school
22 district shall provide access to any material or book specified
23 in the request that is maintained in a district school system
24 library and is available for review.

25 1. Each book made available to students through a school
26 district library media center or included in a recommended or
27 assigned school- or grade-level reading list must be selected by
28 a school district employee who holds a valid educational media
29 specialist certificate, regardless of whether the book is
30 purchased, donated, or otherwise made available to students.

31 2. Each district school board shall adopt procedures for
32 developing library media center collections and post the
33 procedures on the website for each school within the district.
34 The procedures must:

35 a. Require that book selections meet the criteria in s.
36 1006.40(3)(d).

37 b. Require consultation of reputable, professionally
38 recognized reviewing periodicals and school community
39 stakeholders.

40 c. Provide for library media center collections based on
41 reader interest, support of state academic standards and aligned

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42 curriculum, and the academic needs of students and faculty.

43 d. Provide for the regular removal or discontinuance of
44 books based on, at a minimum, physical condition, rate of recent
45 circulation, alignment to state academic standards and relevancy
46 to curriculum, out-of-date content, and required removal
47 pursuant to subparagraph (a)2.

48 3. Each elementary school must publish on its website, in
49 a searchable format prescribed by the department, a list of all
50 materials maintained in the school library media center or
51 required as part of a school- or grade-level reading list.

52 (e) Public participation.—Publish on its website, in a
53 searchable format prescribed by the department, a list of all
54 instructional materials, including those used to provide
55 instruction required by s. 1003.42. Each district school board
56 must:

57 1. Provide access to all materials, excluding teacher
58 editions, in accordance with s. 1006.283(2)(a)8.a. before the
59 board takes any official action on such materials. This process
60 must include reasonable safeguards against the unauthorized use,
61 reproduction, and distribution of instructional materials
62 considered for adoption.

63 2. Select, approve, adopt, or purchase all materials as a
64 separate line item on the agenda and must provide a reasonable
65 opportunity for public comment. The use of materials described
66 in this paragraph may not be selected, approved, or adopted as

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67 part of a consent agenda.

68 3. Annually, beginning June 30, 2023, submit to the
69 Commissioner of Education a report that identifies:

70 a. Each material not purchased from the state-adopted list
71 for which the school district received an objection pursuant to
72 subparagraph (a)2. for the school year and the specific
73 objections thereto.

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
