A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the Summer Youth Service Learning Program; providing a short title; creating s. 446.046, F.S.; creating the program within the Department of Education; providing the purpose of the program; providing eligibility requirements for students and employers to participate in the program; requiring and authorizing specified entities to participate in the program; requiring the department to create a statewide employment hub for the program; requiring participating employers to post employment opportunities to the employment hub; requiring school districts and public postsecondary institutions to notify students of the employment hub; providing requirements for the employment hub; authorizing employers to provide students with a bus pass for a specified time period under certain circumstances; requiring participating employers to provide participating students with an accurate letter of recommendation; providing for implementation of the program; requiring the State Board of Education to adopt rules; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. This act may be cited as the "Youth Service Learning and Employment Assistance Initiative Act."

Section 2. Section 446.046, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

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446.046 Summer Youth Service Learning Program. -

- (1) PURPOSE.—The Summer Youth Service Learning Program is created within the department to match low-income and moderate—income students who have outstanding academic records or trade skills with appropriate summer employment opportunities at state agencies, school districts, local governments, and participating private businesses that will prepare participating students for entering the workforce as adults. Such summer employment opportunities shall be funded by the Legislature and shall enable students to gain meaningful work experience and exposure to exciting career industries; to interact with working professionals in a positive environment; and to learn and develop skills, attitudes, and the necessary commitment to succeed in today's world of work.
- (2) STUDENT ELIGIBILITY.—To be eligible to participate in the program, a student must:
 - (a) Be between the ages of 14 and 22, inclusive.
- (b) Be enrolled in a secondary school or postsecondary educational institution within this state.
- (c) Be in good academic standing, as established by the State Board of Education pursuant to subsection (8).
- (d) Be responsible for his or her own transportation to and from his or her employment through the program unless provided a bus pass as provided in subsection (5).
 - (e) Meet any other criteria established by the state board.
- (3) PARTICIPATING EMPLOYERS.—Each state agency and district school board shall, and local governments and local private businesses may, participate in the program. To provide summer employment opportunities to students pursuant to this section, a

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participating employer must:

- (a) Comply with chapter 448, part I of chapter 450, and all applicable federal laws and regulations.
- (b) Post any summer employment opportunities for participating students on the department's employment hub pursuant to subsection (4).
- (c) Meet any other requirements established by the state board.
 - (4) EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES AND EMPLOYMENT HUB.-
- (a) The department shall create a statewide employment hub website for the posting of summer employment opportunities available to students through the program. Participating employers shall post available summer employment opportunities to the employment hub. Each school district and public postsecondary institution shall notify students of the availability of the employment hub. The employment hub must include:
- 1. A mechanism for students to search for summer employment opportunities in their respective areas. Such mechanism must allow students to search by both geographic area and job responsibilities.
- 2. Information about the requirements for each job, including any necessary qualifications.
- 3. An online application for students to complete for employment opportunities available through the program.
- (b) Summer employment opportunities available through the program must focus on developing trade skills or work experience that will assist a student to gain full-time employment upon completing his or her education.

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(5) TRANSPORTATION FOR PARTICIPATING STUDENTS.—A participating employer under this section, upon request of an employed student, may provide him or her with a bus pass that is good for the duration of the student's summer employment to assist the student with work-related transportation.

- (6) LETTER OF RECOMMENDATION.—Each participating employer must provide a participating student with a letter of recommendation at the end of his or her summer employment. The letter of recommendation must be an honest and accurate recounting of the student's performance in the program.
- (7) FUNDING.—This program shall be implemented to the extent that funding is made available in the General Appropriations Act.
- (8) RULES.—The state board shall adopt rules to administer the program. Such rules must include, at a minimum, criteria for:
- (a) Student eligibility and academic standards for participation in the program.
 - (b) The participation of private businesses in the program.
- (c) Summer employment opportunities available through the program.
 - Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2022.
