Section 1. Subsections (1) and (2) of section 418.21, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

418.21 Governing body.-16

- (1) The governing body of a recreation district shall be determined by ordinance of the municipality or county that created the district and must be either:
- (a) A five-member or larger board of supervisors elected from among the property owners or residents of the district. For a board elected by the property owners of the district, voting is limited to one owner for each residential lot; $_{\tau}$ or
- (b) The governing body of the municipality or county that created the district.
 - (2) (a) If the governing body is a board of supervisors: 7
- (a) The ordinance must specify the date of the election and which must provide that each property owners owner or residents resident in the district have has the right to vote in the

The ordinance may also provide for the establishment of designated geographic areas within the district from each of which are elected one or more members of the board of supervisors are elected to represent that area, provided the ordinance is made contingent on approval by a majority vote of the electors in each designated area.

Section 2. Subsection (4) of section 418.22, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

- 418.22 Powers of recreation districts.—The charter of a recreation district may grant to the recreation district the following powers and all further or additional powers as the governing body of the municipality or county establishing the district may deem necessary or useful in order to exercise the powers for which provision is hereinafter made. The powers which may be granted by such charter include the following:
- (4) To issue bonds, secured by ad valorem taxes or by pledge of both such taxes and other revenues of the district, if approved at a referendum held in such district, and to levy and collect ad valorem taxes, without limitation or with such limitation as may be imposed by charter, on all real property subject to city taxation within such district in order to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same respectively fall due or to accumulate a sinking fund for the payment of principal and interest. The referendum required by

this <u>subsection</u> <u>section</u> may be held on the same day as any other referendum related to the district; provided that such bonds <u>shall</u> bear interest at a rate pursuant to s. 215.84 <u>and be sold</u> at <u>public sale</u>. In the event an offer of an issue of bonds at <u>public sale produces no bid</u>, or in the event all bids received are rejected. The district <u>may sell</u> the bonds at <u>public sale or</u> is authorized to negotiate for the sale of such bonds under such rates and terms <u>that comply with state law and as</u> are acceptable; provided that <u>the no such</u> bonds <u>may not shall</u> be sold or delivered on terms less favorable than the terms contained in any bids rejected at <u>a the public sale thereof</u> or the terms contained in <u>a the notice</u> of public sale if no bids were received at such public sale.

Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2022.
