Section 2. Subsection (8) of section 1002.34, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

1002.34 Charter technical career centers.-

- (8) ELIGIBLE STUDENTS.—A center must be open to all students as space is available and may not discriminate in admissions policies or practices on the basis of an individual's physical disability or proficiency in English or on any other basis that would be unlawful if practiced by a public school or a Florida College System institution. A student awarded a certificate of completion under s. 1003.4282 is eligible to enroll in workforce education programs under s. 1011.80. A center may establish reasonable criteria by which to evaluate prospective students, which criteria must be outlined in the charter, and must identify workforce education programs in which a student who has been awarded a certificate of completion under s. 1003.4282 is eligible to enroll.
- Section 3. Paragraph (c) of subsection (6) of section 1003.4282, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
- 1003.4282 Requirements for a standard high school diploma.—
 - (6) AWARD OF A STANDARD HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA. -
- (c) A student who earns the required 24 credits, or the required 18 credits under s. 1002.3105(5), but fails to pass the assessments required under s. 1008.22(3) or achieve a 2.0 GPA shall be awarded a certificate of completion in a form

prescribed by the State Board of Education. However, before the award of a certificate of completion, a student must be advised of available educational options, including workforce education programs under s. 1011.80, adult general education programs as defined in s. 1004.02(3), and the option who is otherwise entitled to a certificate of completion may elect to remain in high school either as a full-time student or a part-time student for up to 1 additional year and receive special instruction designed to remedy his or her identified deficiencies.

Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2022.
