17	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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19	Section 1. Section 394.9088, Florida Statutes, is created
20	to read:
21	394.9088 Veteran Suicide Prevention Training Pilot
22	Program.—
23	(1) The Department of Veterans' Affairs shall establish the
24	Veteran Suicide Prevention Training Pilot Program. The purpose
25	of the pilot program is to offer to each Department of Veterans'
26	Affairs claims examiner and each county and city veteran service
27	officer, as described in s. 292.11, specialized training and
28	certification in the prevention of veteran suicide.
29	(2) Individuals electing to participate in the pilot

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30	program must be trained to identify indicators of elevated
31	suicide risk and provide emergency crisis referrals for veterans
32	expressing or exhibiting symptoms of emotional or psychological
33	distress. The Department of Veterans' Affairs shall contract
34	with an organization having proven experience developing and
35	implementing veteran-relevant and evidence-based suicide
36	prevention training to develop the curriculum for such training.
37	The department shall establish and oversee the process for
38	certifying program participants who successfully complete such
39	training.
40	(3) The Department of Veterans' Affairs shall adopt rules
41	necessary to implement the pilot program.
42	(4) The Department of Veterans' Affairs shall submit a
43	report to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the
44	House of Representatives by June 30 of each year which includes
45	information concerning the pilot program and whether any changes
46	should be made to the pilot program which would increase its
47	effectiveness. In its report submitted by June 30, 2026, the
48	department shall include a recommendation of whether the pilot
49	program should be continued.
50	Section 2. The sum of \$500,000 in nonrecurring funds is
51	appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of
52	Veterans' Affairs for the purpose of implementing this act.
53	Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2022.

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
