- (b) Must calculate such damages, fees, or charges based on the amount billed to a customer for the hauler collection service billed that day at the daily rate. The calculated amount may not exceed 50 percent of the billed amount for that specific customer that day.
- (c) Must apply such damages, fees, or charges to all contracts executed or renewed on or after July 1, 2022.
