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16	Section 1. Subsections (1) and (6) of section 112.1815,
17	Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

22	(1) For purposes of this section only, the term "first
23	responder" as used in this section means a law enforcement
24	officer as defined in <u>s. 943.10(1)</u> s. 943.10 , a firefighter as
25	defined in <u>s. 633.102(9)</u> s. 633.102 , or an emergency medical
26	technician or paramedic as defined in s. 401.23 <u>, a correctional</u>
27	officer as defined in s. 943.10(2), a correctional probation
28	officer as defined in s. 943.10(3), or a 911 public safety
29	telecommunicator as defined in s. 401.465(1) employed by state

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30	or local government. The term includes first responders serving
31	in a volunteer capacity who are law enforcement officer,
32	firefighter, or emergency medical technician or paramedic
33	engaged by the state or a local government is also considered a
34	first responder of the state or local government for purposes of
35	this section.
36	(6) An employing agency of a first responder , including
37	volunteer first responders, must provide <u>at least 1 hour of</u>
38	educational training related to mental health awareness,
39	prevention, mitigation, and treatment <u>annually</u> . <u>Such training</u>
40	may be provided in person, in video format, or through other
41	electronic means. The required educational training must include
42	specific training on evidence-based coping strategies to
43	mitigate traumatic stress in first responders, as well as
44	information on suicide prevention and peer support for first
45	responders under s. 111.09. Additional training may include, but
46	is not limited to, information relating to emotional support
47	animals as defined in s. 760.27(1). The training required under
48	this subsection must be provided by a mental health practitioner
49	licensed under chapter 490 or chapter 491 who specializes in
50	posttraumatic stress disorder.
51	Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2022.

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
