illegitimately attempt to mitigate the responsibility of a perpetrator for harm done to a lesbian, gay, bisexual, or transgender individual.

- (2) DEFINITIONS.—As used in this section, the term:
- (a) "Gay and transgender panic legal defense" means a legal strategy that asks a judge or a jury to find that a victim's sexual orientation or gender identity is the cause of the defendant's reaction and commission of a criminal offense.
- (b) "Gender expression" or "gender identity" means genderrelated identity, appearance, or behavior, regardless of whether
  such gender-related identity, appearance, or behavior is
  different from that traditionally associated with a person's
  physiology or assigned sex at birth.
- (c) "Sexual orientation" means an individual's actual or perceived heterosexuality, homosexuality, or bisexuality.
- (3) PROHIBITION ON GAY AND TRANSGENDER PANIC LEGAL DEFENSE.—A nonviolent sexual advance or the perception or belief, even if inaccurate, of the sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or gender expression of an individual may not be used as a defense to a criminal offense, to excuse or to justify the conduct of an individual who commits a criminal offense, or to mitigate the severity of a criminal offense during sentencing.
  - Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2022.
