26 discontinued as soon as the threat posed by the dangerous 27 behavior has dissipated. Techniques or devices such as 28 straightjackets, zip ties, handcuffs, or tie downs may not be 29 used in ways that may obstruct or restrict breathing or blood 30 flow or that place a student in a facedown position with the 31 student's hands restrained behind the student's back. Physical 32 restraint techniques may not be used to inflict pain to induce 33 compliance.

34 <u>(c) (b)</u> Notwithstanding the authority provided in s.
35 1003.32, <u>physical</u> restraint <u>may shall</u> be used only to protect
36 the safety of students, school personnel, or others and may not
37 be used for student discipline or to correct student
38 noncompliance.

39 <u>(d)(c)</u> The degree of force applied during physical 40 restraint must be only that degree of force necessary to protect 41 the student or others from imminent risk of serious injury. 42 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2022.
