14 (2) DEFINITIONS.—As used in this section, the term:

15 (a) "Law enforcement agency" means a lawfully established
 16 state or local public agency having primary responsibility for

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17 the prevention and detection of crime or the enforcement of
18 penal, traffic, highway, regulatory, game, immigration, postal,
19 customs, or controlled substance laws.

20 (b) "Retired law enforcement dog" means a dog that was
21 previously in the service of or employed by a law enforcement
22 agency in this state for the principal purpose of aiding in the
23 detection of criminal activity, enforcement of laws, or
24 apprehension of offenders and that received certification in
25 obedience and apprehension work from a certifying organization,
26 such as the National Police Canine Association, Inc., or other
27 certifying organization.

28 (c) "Veterinarian" has the same meaning as provided in s.
29 474.202.

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
