- (3) Any person injured as a result of a violation of this section may bring a civil cause of action for treble damages, injunctive relief, or any other appropriate relief in law. The court may issue a temporary or permanent injunction to prevent a violation of this section. The issuance of an injunction does not affect the availability of damages under this section. The court shall award a prevailing plaintiff reasonable attorney fees and costs.
- (4) A civil cause of action may not be brought under this section for the enforcement of a contract under s. 542.335.
