Remove lines 31-42 and insert:

7 (2) Beginning with the 2022-2023 academic year, a disabled
8 veteran enrolled in a program of education approved for
9 educational assistance under 38 U.S.C. s. 3313, at a state
10 university, a Florida College System institution, a career
11 center operated by a school district under s. 1001.44, or a
12 charter technical career center who does not qualify for the 100
13 percent eligibility tier under federal law is eligible to
14 receive a waiver for tuition and fees. The waiver amount is
15 equal to the difference between the portion of tuition and fees
16 paid in accordance with federal law and the full amount of

17 tuition and fees at the institution attended. The amount awarded
18 by the state is not to be determined until after the application
19 of federal benefits under 38 U.S.C. s. 3313.
