Section 2. Subsection (9) of section 267.0612, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

267.0612 Florida Historical Commission; creation; membership; powers and duties.—In order to enhance public participation and involvement in the preservation and protection of the state's historic and archaeological sites and properties, there is created within the Department of State the "Florida Historical Commission." The commission shall serve in an advisory capacity to the director of the Division of Historical Resources to assist the director in carrying out the purposes,

duties, and responsibilities of the division, as specified in this chapter.

(9) The commission shall provide recommendations to the Governor, the Attorney General, the Chief Financial Officer, the Commissioner of Agriculture, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives Department of Management Services on the design and placement of monuments authorized by general law to be placed on the premises of the Capitol Complex pursuant to s. 265.111.

Section 3. Section 272.04, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

- 272.04 Department to allocate space; closing buildings.-
- (1) The Department of Management Services shall have authority to allocate space to house the various departments, agencies, boards, and commissions in said buildings, excepting, however, the new Supreme Court Building, for which authority shall be vested in the justices of the Supreme Court.
- (2) During a state of emergency declared pursuant to s.

 252.36, the Department of Management Services must consult with
 the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of
 the House of Representatives before closing buildings within the
 Capitol Center. If any buildings are closed within the Capitol
 Center, the department must consult with the Governor, the
 President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of
 Representatives before reopening the buildings.

Section 4. Section 272.09, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

272.09 Management, maintenance, and upkeep of Capitol Center.—

- (1) The management, maintenance, and upkeep of the Capitol Center as described defined in s. 272.03, are hereby vested in and made the direct obligation of the Department of Management Services, which shall have authority to do all things necessary to satisfactorily accomplish these functions, including the employment of a superintendent of grounds and buildings and other employees; the establishment of central repair and maintenance shops; and the designation or appointment of nonsalaried advisory committees to advise with them.
- (2) By December 1, 2022, and annually thereafter, the Department of Management Services shall submit to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives a Capitol Center maintenance and upkeep report. The report must describe the Capitol Center maintenance and repairs provided in the prior year and planned for the upcoming year and must include the costs of prior repairs and cost estimates for future repairs. The report should also describe any necessary structural modifications, security improvements, and major repairs to the buildings and grounds.

Section 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 2022.
