35 | Section 2. Notwithstanding s. 418.302(3), Florida  
 36 | Statutes, or any law to the contrary, if the referendum election  
 37 | referenced in section 1 of this act is approved by the electors  
 38 | of the district in the election of November 2022, the Board of  
 39 | County Commissioners of Brevard County shall amend the Charter  
 40 | of Barefoot Bay Recreation District to limit the number of terms  
 41 | of the members of the board of trustees of the district to no  
 42 | more than 3 successive complete 2-year terms or 2 successive  
 43 | complete 3-year terms. A trustee may not serve more than 6  
 44 | consecutive years. Beginning with the election to be held in  
 45 | November 2023, if any potential candidate's election to a 3-year  
 46 | term would result in the candidate serving as a trustee for more  
 47 | than 6 consecutive years, the candidate may not be qualified for  
 48 | election to the board of trustees. A member of the board of  
 49 | trustees to whom this limitation applies may serve no sooner  
 50 | than 3 years after the expiration of the member's last

51 successive complete term. This limitation shall not apply to the  
52 portion of any unexpired term served by appointment to fill a  
53 vacant seat pursuant to s. 418.302(5), Florida Statutes. If the  
54 referendum referenced in section 1 of this act is approved by  
55 the electors of the district in the election of November 2022,  
56 this section shall supersede and replace section 1 of chapter  
57 2017-202, Laws of Florida, otherwise section 1 of chapter 2017-  
58 202, Laws of Florida, shall remain in full force and effect.

59 Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
