Paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section 77 320.06, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 78 320.06 Registration certificates, license plates, and validation stickers generally.-79 80 (1)Except as provided in ss. 320.0805(1) and 81 (b)1. 82 320.08056(3), registration license plates bearing a graphic 83 symbol and the alphanumeric system of identification shall be 84 issued for a 10-year period. At the end of the 10-year period, 85 upon renewal, the plate shall be replaced. The department shall extend the scheduled license plate replacement date from a 6-86 87 year period to a 10-year period. The fee for such replacement is \$28, \$2.80 of which shall be paid each year before the plate is 88 89 replaced, to be credited toward the next \$28 replacement fee. 90 The fees shall be deposited into the Highway Safety Operating 91 Trust Fund. A credit or refund may not be given for any prior 92 years' payments of the prorated replacement fee if the plate is 93 replaced or surrendered before the end of the 10-year period, 94 except that a credit may be given if a registrant is required by 95 the department to replace a license plate under s. 96 320.08056(11)(a) s. 320.08056(8)(a). With each license plate, a validation sticker shall be issued showing the owner's birth 97 98 month, license plate number, and the year of expiration or the 99 appropriate renewal period if the owner is not a natural person. The validation sticker shall be placed on the upper right corner 100

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101 of the license plate. The license plate and validation sticker 102 shall be issued based on the applicant's appropriate renewal 103 period. The registration period is 12 months, the extended 104 registration period is 24 months, and all expirations occur 105 based on the applicant's appropriate registration period. Rental vehicles taxed pursuant to s. 320.08(6)(a) may elect a permanent 106 107 registration period, provided payment of the appropriate license taxes and fees occurs annually. A vehicle that has an 108 109 apportioned registration shall be issued an annual license plate and a cab card that denote the declared gross vehicle weight for 110 111 each apportioned jurisdiction in which the vehicle is authorized 112 to operate.

531 (9) (6) Except as otherwise provided in this section, 532 specialty license plates must bear the design required by law 533 for the appropriate specialty license plate τ and the designs and 534 colors must conform to the department's design specifications. 535 In addition to a design, the specialty license plates may bear the imprint of numerals from 1 to 999, inclusive, capital 536 537 letters "A" through "Z," or a combination thereof. 621 <u>(13)(a)(10)(a)</u> A specialty license plate annual use fee 622 collected and distributed under this chapter, or any interest 623 earned from those fees, may not be used for commercial or for-624 profit activities nor for general or administrative expenses, 625 except as authorized by s. 320.08058 or to pay the cost of the

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626 audit or report required by s. 320.08062(1). The fees and any 627 interest earned from the fees may be expended only for use in 628 this state unless the annual use fee is derived from the sale of United States Armed Forces and veterans-related specialty 629 630 license plates pursuant to paragraph (6) (d) (3) (d) for the 631 Support Our Troops, American Legion, and Honor Flight license 632 plates; paragraphs (7) (b), (q), and (v) $\frac{(4)(b)}{(4)}$, $\frac{(q)}{(q)}$, and $\frac{(v)}{(v)}$ for 633 the Florida Salutes Veterans, United States Marine Corps, and 634 Military Services license plates, respectively; and s. 320.0891 635 for the U.S. Paratrooper license plate.

(b) As used in this subsection, the term "administrative
expenses" means those expenditures which are considered as
direct operating costs of the organization. Such costs include,
but are not limited to, the following:

Administrative salaries of employees and officers of
the organization who do not or cannot prove, via detailed daily
time sheets, that they actively participate in program
activities.

654 (14) (11) The annual use fee from the sale of specialty 655 license plates, the interest earned from those fees, or any fees 656 received by any entity as a result of the sale of specialty 657 license plates may not be used for the purpose of marketing to, 658 or lobbying, entertaining, or rewarding, an employee of a 659 governmental agency that is responsible for the sale and 660 distribution of specialty license plates, or an elected member or employee of the Legislature. This subsection does not apply 661 662 to specialty license plates marketed and sold by the private

663 <u>vendor</u>.

664 (15) (12) Notwithstanding s. 320.08058(3)(a), the 665 department, in cooperation with the independent colleges or 666 universities as described in s. 1009.89, shall create a standard 667 template specialty license plate with a unique logo or graphic 668 identifying each independent college or university. Each 669 independent college or university may elect to use this standard 670 template specialty license plate in lieu of its own specialty 671 license plate. Annual use fees from the sale of these license plates shall be distributed to the independent college or 672 673 university for which the logo or graphic is displayed on the 674 license plate and shall be used as provided in s. 320.08058(3). 675 Independent colleges or universities opting to use the standard

692 (17) (14) Before the issuance of vouchers for the presale 693 of an out-of-state college or university license plate, the 694 department shall determine whether the state in which the out-695 of-state college or university is located has authorized any 696 license plates for colleges or universities located in this 697 state. The department may not issue any out-of-state college or 698 university license plate unless the state in which the college 699 or university is located has authorized license plates for colleges or universities located in this state. 700

The 713 plate must bear the colors and design approved by the department 714 and must include the official logo, graphic, or color as 715 appropriate for each organization. (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall be distributed as follows:

724 2. Ten percent of the proceeds shall be distributed to the725 Association to Preserve African American Society, History and

e. Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc.-Eighty-five percent shall be distributed to the Delta Research and Educational Foundation, Inc., to promote community awareness and action through educational, economic, and cultural service activities within this state.

f. Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc.-Eighty-five percent shall be distributed to the TMB Charitable Foundation, Inc., to promote community awareness and action through educational, economic, and cultural service activities within this state.

9. Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc.-Eighty-five percent shall be distributed to the Florida Pearls, Inc., to promote community awareness and action through educational, economic, and cultural service activities within this state.

h. Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Inc.-Eighty-five percent
shall be distributed to the Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority National
Education Fund, Inc., to promote community awareness and action
through educational, economic, and cultural service activities
within this state.

i. Iota Phi Theta Fraternity, Inc.-Eighty-five percent
shall be distributed to the National Iota Foundation, Inc., to
promote community awareness and action through educational,
economic, and cultural service activities within this state.
(c)1. To be eligible for issuance of a Divine Nine license

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776 plate representing an organization listed in sub-subparagraphs 777 (b)3.a.-i., a person must be a resident of this state who is the 778 registered owner of a motor vehicle and who is a member of the 779 applicable organization. The person must also present proof of 780 membership in the organization, which may be established by:

781 a. A card distributed by the organization indicating the782 person's membership in the organization; or

b. A written letter on the organization's letterhead which
