16	Section 1. Subsection (7) of section 1012.56, Florida
17	Statutes, is amended to read:

19	(7) TYPES AND TERMS OF CERTIFICATION
20	(a) The Department of Education shall issue a professional
21	certificate for a period not to exceed 5 years to any applicant
22	who fulfills one of the following:
23	1. Meets all the applicable requirements outlined in
24	subsection (2).
25	2. For a professional certificate covering grades 6
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26 through 12:

a. Meets the applicable requirements of paragraphs (2) (a) -(h).

b. Holds a master's or higher degree in the area ofscience, technology, engineering, or mathematics.

d. Is rated highly effective as determined by the
teacher's performance evaluation under s. 1012.34, based in part
on student performance as measured by a statewide, standardized

e. Achieves a passing score on the Florida professionaleducation competency examination required by state board rule.

Meets the applicable requirements of paragraphs (2) (a) -(h) and completes a professional preparation and education 42 43 competence program approved by the department pursuant to 44 paragraph (8)(c) or an educator preparation institute approved 45 by the department pursuant to s. 1004.85. An applicant who 46 completes one of these programs and is rated highly effective as 47 determined by his or her performance evaluation under s. 1012.34 48 is not required to take or achieve a passing score on the 49 professional education competency examination in order to be awarded a professional certificate. 50

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51 The department shall issue a temporary certificate to (b) 52 any applicant who: 53 1. Completes the requirements outlined in paragraphs 54 (2) (a)-(f) and completes the subject area content requirements 55 specified in state board rule or demonstrates mastery of subject 56 area knowledge pursuant to subsection (5) and holds an 57 accredited degree or a degree approved by the Department of Education at the level required for the subject area 58 59 specialization in state board rule; or 60 2. Documents 48 months of active-duty military service with an honorable discharge or a medical separation; completes 61 62 the requirements outlined in paragraphs (2)(a), (b), (d), (e), 63 and (f); completes the subject area content requirements 64 specified in state board rule or demonstrates mastery of subject 65 area knowledge pursuant to subsection (5); documents completion 66 of 60 college credits with a minimum cumulative grade point 67 average of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale, as provided by one or more 68 accredited institutions of higher learning or a nonaccredited 69 institution of higher learning identified by the Department of 70 Education as having a quality program resulting in a bachelor's degree or higher; and enrolls in a teacher preparation program 71 approved pursuant to s. 1004.04. 72

(c) The department shall issue one nonrenewable 2-year temporary certificate and one nonrenewable 5-year professional certificate to a qualified applicant who holds a bachelor's

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76 degree in the area of speech-language impairment to allow for 77 completion of a master's degree program in speech-language 78 impairment. 79 (d) A person who is issued a temporary certificate under 80 subparagraph (b)2. must be assigned a teacher mentor for a minimum of 2 school years commencing employment. A temporary certificate issued under subparagraph (b)2. 94 is valid for 5 school fiscal years, is limited to a one-time 95 issuance, and is nonrenewable. 96 97 At least 1 year before an individual's temporary certificate is 98 set to expire, the department shall electronically notify the 99 individual of the date on which his or her certificate will expire and provide a list of each method by which the 100

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101 qualifications for a professional certificate can be completed. 102 The State Board of Education shall adopt rules to allow the 103 department to extend the validity period of a temporary 104 certificate for 2 years when the requirements for the 105 professional certificate were not completed due to the serious illness or injury of the applicant, the military service of an 106 107 applicant's spouse, other extraordinary extenuating circumstances, or if the certificateholder is rated highly 108 109 effective in the immediate prior year's performance evaluation pursuant to s. 1012.34 or has completed a 2-year mentorship 110 program pursuant to s. 1012.56(8). The department shall extend 111 the temporary certificate upon approval by the Commissioner of 112 Education. A written request for extension of the certificate 113 114 shall be submitted by the district school superintendent, the 115 governing authority of a university lab school, the governing 116 authority of a state-supported school, or the governing 117 authority of a private school.
