House Memorial

A memorial to the Congress of the United States, urging Congress to oppose the intrusive Internal Revenue Service reporting requirements placed on financial institutions included in the Biden administration's tax increase proposal.

WHEREAS, the Biden administration's tax increase proposal for fiscal year 2022 includes a number of provisions that would place undue burdens on financial institutions, small businesses, and law-abiding citizens, and

WHEREAS, one proposal seeks to increase tax payment enforcement measures by requiring peer-to-peer payment transaction applications as well as financial institutions to annually report aggregated data on all account inflows and outflows of \$10,000 or more to the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), and

WHEREAS, the reports would also disclose whether transactions involved physical cash, foreign accounts, or transfers between accounts with the same owner, negatively impacting the privacy rights of Americans, compliance costs, and low-income communities, and

WHEREAS, the proposal's \$10,000 threshold for reporting would ensnare many active financial institution accounts, including those owned by individuals and small businesses,

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requiring the financial data of the majority of those accounts to be sent to the IRS, an agency that experiences more than one billion cyberattacks each year, and

WHEREAS, a June 2021 ProPublica article revealed a massive leak of tax return data from the IRS, demonstrating that the agency is unable or unwilling to protect taxpayer information, and given its many vulnerabilities in cybersecurity, the IRS should not be trusted with more private information, and

WHEREAS, by holding financial institutions responsible for data collection and reporting, the proposal would force financial institutions to increase spending on additional staffing, technology, and other resources, which could then be passed on to the depositors, thus burdening tax-compliant citizens and small businesses, and

WHEREAS, the Biden administration's tax increase proposal fails to consider cybersecurity risks and unjust burdens on law-abiding citizens, financial institutions, and small businesses, and the United States Congress should oppose this unprecedented intrusion into the privacy rights of Americans, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

That the Congress of the United States is urged to oppose the intrusive Internal Revenue Service reporting requirements

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placed on financial institutions included in the Biden administration's tax increase proposal.

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be dispatched to the President of the United States, to the President of the United States Senate, to the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, and to each member of the Florida delegation to the United States Congress.

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
