Remove lines 182-183 and insert:

Section 7. Section 509.105, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

509.105 Outdoor kitchen equipment.-

(1) As used in this section, the term "outdoor kitchen equipment" means equipment used to prepare, serve, or sell food for immediate consumption, including a cooking appliance, that is owned by, is adjacent to, and operates in conjunction with a licensed public food service establishment.

(2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, outdoor kitchen equipment:

16 (a) Is not required to be separately covered, have
17 overhead protection or hoods, or be enclosed. However, outdoor
18 kitchen equipment must meet all other applicable laws, codes,
19 standards, and rules, including for fire safety and sanitation.

20 (b) May be used to prepare, serve, or sell food for
21 immediate consumption as provided in this chapter. Any food that
22 is prepared on outdoor kitchen equipment must be kept at
23 appropriate temperatures and prepared using sanitation
24 practices, as required by this chapter. Such food may not be
25 permanently stored outdoors but is permitted to be temporarily
26 stored outside the licensed food service establishments'
27 enclosure while preparation is taking place on such kitchen
28 equipment.

29 (c) Is subject to all other provisions of this chapter
30 that apply to public food service establishments, including but
31 not limited to, sanitation standards, food safety training,
32 inspections, enforcement, and disciplinary action.

33 (3) A local law, ordinance, or regulation may not
34 prohibit, or have the effect of prohibiting, the use of outdoor
35 kitchen equipment.

36 (4) This section does not prevent the department or a
37 local health department from issuing and enforcing an order to
38 cease and desist use of outdoor kitchen equipment if the
39 equipment is the source of an adulterated food or of an outbreak
40 of illness caused by contaminated food.
