 27 (b) If the Legislature has approved 125 ~~150~~ or more
 28 specialty license plates, the department may not issue any new
 29 specialty license plates until a sufficient number of plates are
 30 discontinued pursuant to s. 320.08056(8) such that the number of
 31 plates being issued does not exceed 125 ~~150~~. Notwithstanding s.
 32 320.08056(8) (a), the 125-license-plate ~~150-license-plate~~ limit
 33 includes license plates above the minimum sales threshold and
 34 those exempt from that threshold.

35 Section 2. Subsections (47) and (79) of section 320.08058,
 36 Florida Statutes, are amended, and subsections (119) through
 37 (123) are added to that section, to read:

39 (47) LIVE THE DREAM LICENSE PLATES.—

40 (a) The department shall develop a Live the Dream license
 41 plate as provided in this section. Live the Dream license plates
 42 must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The
 43 word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the
 44 words "Live the Dream" must appear at the bottom of the plate.

45 (b) The proceeds of the annual use fee shall be
 46 distributed to the Dream Foundation, Inc., to be used in the
 47 following manner:

48 1. Up to 5 percent may be used to administer, promote, and
 49 market the license plate.

50 2. At least 40 ~~60~~ percent shall be distributed equally

51 among the sickle cell organizations that are Florida members of
52 the Sickle Cell Disease Association of America, Inc., for
53 programs that provide research, care, and treatment for sickle
54 cell disease.

55 3. At least 10 percent shall be used for programs and
56 services provided directly by the Dream Foundation, Inc., which
57 assist inmates released from the custody of a county jail in
58 this state or a Department of Corrections facility in
59 successfully reentering the community.

60 4. At least 15 percent shall be distributed as grants for
61 programs and services throughout this state which assist inmates
62 released from the custody of a county jail in this state or a
63 Department of Corrections facility in successfully reentering
64 the community.

65 ~~5.3.~~ At least 25 30 percent shall be distributed as
66 scholarships to graduating high school seniors in this state who
67 have at least one parent or legal guardian who is incarcerated,
68 for the purpose of attending a state university, a Florida
69 College System institution, a career center operated by a school
70 district under s. 1001.44, or a charter technical career center
71 under s. 1002.34. Scholarships shall be awarded through a
72 competitive application process to Chapman Partnership, Inc.,

79 | (79) BLUE ANGELS LICENSE PLATES.—

80 | (a) The department shall develop a Blue Angels license
 81 | plate for display on a motor vehicle and for display on a
 82 | motorcycle as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The
 83 | plate must bear the colors and design approved by the
 84 | department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the
 85 | plate, and the words "Home of the Blue Angels" must appear at
 86 | the bottom of the plate. Any department-approved image must be
 87 | placed on the far left side of a plate for display on a
 88 | motorcycle.

89 | (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall
 90 | be distributed to the Naval Aviation Museum Foundation, a
 91 | nonprofit Florida corporation under s. 501(c)(3) of the Internal
 92 | Revenue Code, to fund the maintenance, programs, marketing, and
 93 | projects of the foundation, including the National Naval
 94 | Aviation Museum and the National Flight Academy in Pensacola. Up
 95 | to 10 percent of the funds received by the Naval Aviation Museum
 96 | Foundation may be used for marketing of the plate and costs
 97 | directly associated with the administration of the foundation.
 98 | The Naval Aviation Museum Foundation shall distribute 50 percent
 99 | of the funds to eligible programs and projects associated with
 100 | the National Flight Academy and the remainder of the funds to

101 eligible programs and projects associated with the National
 102 Naval Aviation Museum.

103 (c) The number of valid specialty license plates issued
 104 for display on a motor vehicle or on a motorcycle must be added
 105 together to determine whether the specialty license plate must
 106 be discontinued pursuant to s. 320.08056(8) (a).

107 (119) INTER MIAMI CF LICENSE PLATES.-

108 (a) The department shall develop an Inter Miami CF license
 109 plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The plate
 110 must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The
 111 word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the
 112 words "Inter Miami CF" must appear at the bottom of the plate.

113 (b) Notwithstanding paragraph (9)(b), the annual use fees
 114 from the sale of the plate shall be distributed to Inter Miami
 115 CF Foundation Corporation, a nonprofit corporation under s.
 116 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, which may use a maximum
 117 of 10 percent of the proceeds to promote and market the plate.
 118 The remainder of the proceeds shall be used by Inter Miami CF
 119 Foundation Corporation to plan and execute sports-based
 120 development and direct-service community programs, initiatives,
 121 and events in this state.

122 (120) FLORIDA SWIMS LICENSE PLATES.-

123 (a) The department shall develop a Florida Swims license
 124 plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The plate
 125 must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The

126 word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the
127 words "Swim for Life" must appear at the bottom of the plate.

128 (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall
129 be distributed to the Swimming Pool Education and Safety
130 Foundation, Inc., doing business as Florida Swims, a nonprofit
131 organization under s. 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code,
132 which may use up to 10 percent of the proceeds for
133 administration, promotion, and marketing of the plate. All
134 remaining proceeds shall be used by the Swimming Pool Education
135 and Safety Foundation, Inc., doing business as Florida Swims, to
136 promote swimming pool and water safety and to provide grants and
137 scholarships for childhood swimming lessons in this state.

138 (121) DOWN SYNDROME AWARENESS LICENSE PLATES.-

139 (a) The department shall develop a Down Syndrome Awareness
140 license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The
141 plate must bear the colors and design approved by the
142 department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the
143 plate, and the words "Down Syndrome Awareness" must appear at
144 the bottom of the plate.

145 (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall
146 be distributed to Our City Beautiful, Inc., a Florida nonprofit
147 corporation. Up to 10 percent of the fees may be used for
148 administrative costs and marketing of the plate. Of the
149 remaining fees:

150 1. Fifty percent shall be used to build and maintain

151 HOLLAND, an affordable housing project for independent living
152 for persons with Down syndrome or other intellectual disability.

153 2. Fifteen percent shall be dedicated to Our City
154 Beautiful World Changer scholarships for Florida residents 18
155 years of age or older with Down syndrome who wish to further
156 their education at postsecondary educational institutions
157 located in this state.

158 3. Thirty-five percent shall be used for grants to other
159 nonprofit organizations within this state to support housing,
160 educational scholarships, and employment assistance programs for
161 persons with Down syndrome or other intellectual disability.

162 (122) GOPHER TORTOISE LICENSE PLATES.—

163 (a) The department shall develop a Gopher Tortoise license
164 plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The plate
165 must bear the colors and design approved by the department. The
166 word "Florida" must appear at the top of the plate, and the
167 words "Protect the Gopher Tortoise" must appear at the bottom of
168 the plate.

169 (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall
170 be distributed to Wildlands Conservation, Inc., a nonprofit
171 corporation under s. 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, to
172 fund gopher tortoise and commensal species research, education,
173 and conservation, as well as upland habitat protection,
174 restoration, and management in this state to benefit the gopher
175 tortoise and other upland species. Up to 10 percent of the funds

176 received by Wildlands Conservation, Inc., may be used for
177 marketing of the plate and costs directly associated with the
178 administration of the gopher tortoise protection program.
179 Wildlands Conservation, Inc., shall use and distribute the funds
180 to eligible Florida-based scientific, conservation, and
181 educational organizations for gopher tortoise, commensal
182 species, and upland habitat research, conservation, and
183 management.

184 (123) TAKE STOCK IN CHILDREN LICENSE PLATES.-

185 (a) The department shall develop a Take Stock in Children
186 license plate as provided in this section and s. 320.08053. The
187 plate must bear the colors and design approved by the
188 department. The word "Florida" must appear at the top of the
189 plate, and the words "Take Stock in Children" must appear at the
190 bottom of the plate.

191 (b) The annual use fees from the sale of the plate shall
192 be distributed to Take Stock in Children of Florida, a Florida
193 nonprofit corporation. Up to 10 percent of the fees may be used
194 for administrative costs and marketing of the plate. The
195 remaining funds must be distributed with the approval of, and
196 accountability to, the board of directors of Take Stock in
197 Children of Florida and must be used to promote and support
198 programs that provide mentorship for at-risk students.

199 Section 3. This act shall take effect October 1, 2022.
