12	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

14	Section 1. Section 440.1851, Florida Statutes, is amended
15	to read:
16	440.1851 Personal identifying information of an injured or
17	deceased employee; public records exemption
18	(1) The personal identifying information of an injured or
19	deceased employee which is contained in reports, notices,
20	records, or supporting documentation held by the department
21	pursuant to this chapter is confidential and exempt from s.
22	119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. <u>This</u>
23	public records exemption applies to personal identifying
24	information held by the department before, on, or after the
25	effective date of this exemption.

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26	(a) As used in this section, the term "personal
27	identifying information" means the injured or deceased
28	employee's name, date of birth, home address or mailing address,
29	e-mail address, or telephone number.
30	(2)(a) (b) The department may disclose <u>confidential and</u>
31	exempt personal identifying information made confidential and
32	exempt under this section only:
33	1. To the injured employee, to the spouse or a dependent
34	of the deceased employee, to the spouse or a dependent of the
35	injured employee if authorized by the injured employee, or to
36	the legal representative of the deceased employee's estate;
37	2. To a party litigant, or his or her authorized
38	representative, in matters pending before the Office of the
39	Judges of Compensation Claims;
40	3. To a carrier or an employer for the purpose of
41	investigating the compensability of a claim or for the purpose
42	of administering its anti-fraud investigative unit established
43	pursuant to s. 626.9891;
44	4. In an aggregate reporting format that does not reveal
45	the personal identifying information of any employee;
46	5. Pursuant to a court order or subpoena;
47	6. To an agency for administering its anti-fraud
48	investigative function or in the furtherance of the agency's
49	official duties and responsibilities; or
50	7. To a federal governmental entity in the furtherance of
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51	the entity's official duties and responsibilities.
52	(b) A carrier, employer, agency, or governmental entity
53	receiving confidential and exempt personal identifying
54	information from the department shall maintain the confidential
55	and exempt status of the information.
56	(c) This public records exemption applies to personal
57	identifying information held by the department before, on, or
58	after the effective date of this exemption.
59	(3) (2) A person who willfully and knowingly discloses
60	personal identifying information made confidential and exempt
61	under this section to an unauthorized person or entity commits a
62	misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s.
63	775.082 or s. 775.083.
64	(4) As used in this section, the term "personal
65	identifying information" means the injured or deceased
66	employee's name, date of birth, home address or mailing address,
67	e-mail address, or telephone number.
68	(3) This section is subject to the Open Government Sunset
69	Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand repealed
70	on October 2, 2022, unless reviewed and saved from repeal
71	through reenactment by the Legislature.
72	Section 2. This act shall take effect October 1, 2022.

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
