6 to s. 282.318, Florida Statutes, or s. 282.3185, Florida

10 identifies detection, investigation, or response practices for  
11 suspected or confirmed cybersecurity incidents, including  
12 suspected or confirmed breaches, if the disclosure of such

13 information would facilitate unauthorized access to or  
14 unauthorized modification, disclosure, or destruction of:  
15 1. Data or information, whether physical or virtual; or  
16 2. Information technology resources, which include an  
17 agency's existing or proposed information technology systems.  
18  
19 Release of such information could place an agency at greater  
20 risk of breaches, cybersecurity incidents, and ransomware  
21 attacks. If information related to the coverage limits and  
22 deductible or self-insurance amounts of cybersecurity insurance  
23 were disclosed, it could give cybercriminals an understanding of  
24 the monetary sum an agency can afford or may be willing to pay  
25 as a result of a ransomware attack at the expense of the  
26 taxpayer. In addition, critical infrastructure information is a  
27 vital component of public safety and, if made publicly  
28 available, could aid in the planning of, training for, and  
29 execution of cyberattacks, thereby increasing the ability of  
30 persons to harm individuals in this state. The recent  
31 cybersecurity hacking and shutdown of the Colonial Pipeline by  
32 the criminal enterprise DarkSide in 2021 and the infiltration of  
33 the Bowman Avenue Dam in Rye Brook, New York, by Iranian hackers  
34 in 2013 provide evidence that such criminal capabilities exist.  
35 These events also show the crippling effect that cyberattacks on  
36 critical infrastructure may have. Further, cybersecurity
