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Remove lines 316-364 and insert:

6 (c) Beginning January 1, 2020, Each commissioner of a 7 community redevelopment agency created under part III of chapter 8 163 must complete 4 hours of ethics training each calendar year 9 which addresses, at a minimum, s. 8, Art. II of the State 10 Constitution, the Code of Ethics for Public Officers and Employees, and the public records and public meetings laws of 11 this state. This requirement may be satisfied by completion of a 12 continuing legal education class or other continuing 13 14 professional education class, seminar, or presentation, if the 15 required subject material is covered by the class.

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16	(b)(d) The commission shall adopt rules establishing
17	minimum Course content for the portion of an ethics training
18	class which addresses s. 8, Art. II of the State Constitution
19	and the Code of Ethics for Public Officers and Employees <u>must</u>
20	include one or more of the following:

22	2. Conflicting employment or contractual relationships;

41	accreditation from an applicable licensing body for courses

45	community redevelopment agency created under part III of chapter
