31	the petition be made confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1),

33	Constitution. Persons who are victims of human trafficking and
34	who have been convicted of crimes committed at the behest of
35	their traffickers are themselves victims of crimes. These
36	victims face barriers to employment and loss of other life
37	opportunities, and the fact that they are seeking expungement,
38	as well as the information contained in related pleadings and
39	documents, would expose these petitioners to possible
40	discrimination due to details of their past lives becoming
41	public knowledge. Therefore, it is necessary that the personal
42	identifying information of victims of human trafficking in these
43	petitions, pleadings, and related documents be made confidential
