| 14 | Forced Organ Harvesting from Prisoners of Conscience in China    |
| 15 | released its final judgment containing the finding that China's  |
| 16 | communist regime has for decades practiced systematic forced     |
| 17 | organ removal from prisoners of conscience, including Falun Gong |
| 18 | practitioners, Tibetan Buddhists, House Church Christians, and   |
| 19 | the Uyghurs, and   |
| 20 | WHEREAS, China has welcomed an influx of transplant tourism      |
| 21 | whereby individuals who are critically in need of transplants    |
| 22 | pay thousands of dollars for one of the 60,000 to 90,000         |
| 23 | transplant surgeries conducted each year, with the number of     |
| 24 | transplants far exceeding the number of voluntary organ          |
| 25 | donations in the country, and                                    |

26 WHEREAS, while a patient in the United States is typically 27 placed on a waiting list for the transplant of an organ, which 28 may not be available for months, Chinese hospitals are able to 29 schedule transplants of major organs within 2 weeks, suggesting 30 nefarious foreknowledge regarding the circumstances surrounding 31 the donation of these organs, and

32 WHEREAS, in July 1999, the Chinese Communist Party launched 33 an intensive, nationwide persecution of Falun Gong, a spiritual 34 practice centered on the values of truthfulness, compassion, and 35 tolerance, and

36 WHEREAS, in 2015, Freedom House, a nonprofit, 37 nongovernmental organization, reported that Falun Gong 38 practitioners are the primary victims of forced organ removal 39 and face an elevated risk of dying or being killed while 40 imprisoned, and

WHEREAS, on July 20, 2020, former Secretary of State
Michael R. Pompeo denounced 21 years of persecution of Falun
Gong practitioners by China's communist regime, and

44 WHEREAS, the United Nations Committee Against Torture and 45 the Special Rapporteur on Torture and Other Cruel, Inhuman or 46 Degrading Treatment or Punishment have called on the Chinese 47 government to account for the sources of organs used in its 48 transplant practices, and

49 WHEREAS, several organizations have called for the 50 imposition of sanctions on Chinese medical authorities for 51 China's transplant practices, and 52 WHEREAS, the parliaments of Canada and the European Union, 53 as well as the United States House of Representatives Committee 54 on Foreign Affairs, have adopted resolutions condemning organ 55 harvesting from prisoners of conscience, and 56 WHEREAS, it is imperative to join the international outcry 57 against this major violation of human rights by the People's Republic of China, NOW, THEREFORE, 58 59 60 Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 61 62 That the President and Congress of the United States are urged to condemn the People's Republic of China for its practice 63 64 of forcibly removing human organs for transplant and to pass 65 legislation and adopt measures that prohibit collaboration 66 between United States medical and pharmaceutical companies and 67 any Chinese counterparts linked with forced organ harvesting, 68 that ban individuals who have participated in the unethical 69 removal of human tissues and organs from entering the United 70 States, and that provide for the prosecution of such 71 individuals. 72 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be 73 dispatched to the President of the United States, to the
