House Resolution 1 2 A resolution designating May 18, 2022, as "Haitian 3 Flag Day" in the State of Florida. 4 5 WHEREAS, the Republic of Haiti, an island nation located in 6 the West Indies on the western third of the Island of 7 Hispaniola, declared its independence from French colonial rule 8 on January 1, 1804, following a slave revolt under the 9 leadership of Generals Toussaint L'Ouverture, Jean-Jacques Dessalines, and Alexandre Pétion, becoming the first and only 10 11 state created from a successful slave rebellion, and WHEREAS, Haiti was the first independent nation in Latin 12 13 America and the first postcolonial independent nation led by 14 blacks in the world, and WHEREAS, observed every year on May 18, Haitian Flag Day 15 16 was celebrated secretly in Haiti during United States occupation from 1915 to 1934 and was first celebrated in communities around 17 18 the world in the late 1990s, and WHEREAS, the Haitian flag known today, which was officially 19 20 adopted in 1806 by President Alexandre Pétion, is emblazoned 21 with the country's coat of arms and the colors red and blue, 22 adopted from the flag of France, the country from which Haiti 23 gained its independence, and 24 WHEREAS, General Jean-Jacques Dessalines is regarded as the father of the Haitian flag and, according to Haitian historical 25 Page 1 of 3

26 tradition, was known to have dramatically cut the French 27 tricolor with his saber at the May 1803 Arcahaie conference, 28 ripping away the white of the French flag to symbolize an end to 29 European influence and leaving two strips that Catherine Flon 30 then sewed back together: the blue, which represented the former 31 African slaves brought to Haiti by colonial powers, and the red, 32 which symbolized people of mixed European and African descent, 33 and

WHEREAS, the Haitian flag is a definitive symbol of pride for the Caribbean nation, having become the second republic, after the United States, to defeat a European colonial power in the Americas, and

38 WHEREAS, Haitian Flag Day events are annually observed and 39 celebrated with pride and enthusiasm throughout Florida and the 40 United States, and

41 WHEREAS, as educators, authors, community leaders, activists, athletes, artists, musicians, and politicians, 42 43 Haitians and Haitian Americans have left an indelible mark on every facet of this nation's society and the world, evidenced by 44 45 the accomplishments of such icons as Jean Baptiste Point du 46 Sable, founder of the City of Chicago; civil rights activist 47 W.E.B. Du Bois; National Football League player Pierre Garçon; 48 author and candidate for the Nobel Prize for Literature in 2009, 49 Frankétienne; and Tony Award-winning actress and singer Nikki M.
