35 (d) (c) If funds are available, a student who received an 36 award in the fall or spring term may receive an award in the 37 summer term. Priority in the distribution of summer awards shall 38 be given to students who are within one semester, or equivalent, 39 of completing a degree or certificate program. No student may receive an award for more than the equivalent of 9 semesters or 40 41 14 quarters of full-time enrollment, except as otherwise provided in s. 1009.40(3).
