The Committee on Health Policy (Brodeur) recommended the following:

Senate Amendment (with title amendment)

Delete everything after the enacting clause and insert:

Section 1. Paragraph (b) of subsection (1), subsection (2), paragraphs (g) and (h) of subsection (4), and subsection (5) of section 429.256, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

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> 429.256 Assistance with self-administration of medication.-(1) For the purposes of this section, the term:

(b) <u>"Medication technician"</u> <u>"Unlicensed person"</u> means an

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11 individual not currently licensed to practice nursing or 12 medicine who is employed by or under contract with to an assisted living facility and who has received training on with 13 14 respect to assisting with the self-administration of medication and use of point-of-care devices in an assisted living facility 15 16 as provided under s. 429.52 before prior to providing such 17 assistance as described in this section.

18 (2) Residents who are capable of self-administering their own medications or using their point-of-care devices without 19 20 assistance shall be encouraged and allowed to do so. However, a 21 medication technician an unlicensed person may, consistent with 22 a dispensed prescription's label or the package directions of an 23 over-the-counter medication or point-of-care device, assist a 24 resident whose condition is medically stable with the self-25 administration of routine, regularly scheduled medications that 26 are intended to be self-administered and may assist with a 27 resident's use of point-of-care devices. Assistance with self-28 medication by a medication technician an unlicensed person may 29 occur only upon a documented request by, and the written informed consent of, a resident or the resident's surrogate, quardian, or attorney in fact. For the purposes of this section, self-administered medications include both legend and over-thecounter oral dosage forms, topical dosage forms, transdermal patches, and topical ophthalmic, otic, and nasal dosage forms including solutions, suspensions, sprays, and inhalers.

(4) Assistance with self-administration does not include:

(g) Assisting with medications ordered by the physician or health care professional with prescriptive authority to be given "as needed," unless the order is written with specific

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40 parameters that preclude independent judgment on the part of the 41 <u>medication technician</u> unlicensed person, and the resident 42 requesting the medication is aware of his or her need for the 43 medication and understands the purpose for taking the 44 medication.

(h) Medications for which the time of administration, the amount, the strength of dosage, the method of administration, or the reason for administration requires judgment or discretion on the part of the <u>medication technician</u> <u>unlicensed person</u>.

(5) Assistance with the self-administration of medication by <u>a medication technician</u> an unlicensed person as described in this section <u>is shall</u> not be considered administration as defined in s. 465.003.

Section 2. Subsection (6) of section 429.52, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

429.52 Staff training and educational requirements.-

56 (6) Medication technicians Staff assisting with the self-57 administration of medications and point-of-care devices under s. 58 429.256 must complete a minimum of 6 additional hours of 59 training provided by a registered nurse or a licensed pharmacist 60 before providing assistance. Two hours of continuing education 61 are required annually thereafter. The agency shall establish by 62 rule the minimum requirements for medication technician of this training, which must address infection control, safe handling 63 64 and use of point-of-care devices, communicating with case 65 managers and health care providers, standard of care protocols 66 for the provision of care in a licensed assisted living 67 facility, identification of nursing standards, and methods of assisting residents with the self-administration of medications. 68
