21	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

23	Section 1. Paragraph (b) of subsection (1), subsection
24	(2), and subsection (7) of section 215.559, Florida Statutes,
25	are amended to read:
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26 215.559 Hurricane Loss Mitigation Program.—A Hurricane
27 Loss Mitigation Program is established in the Division of
28 Emergency Management.

(1) The Legislature shall annually appropriate \$10 million of the moneys authorized for appropriation under s. 215.555(7)(c) from the Florida Hurricane Catastrophe Fund to the division for the purposes set forth in this section. Of the amount:

34 (b) Three million dollars in funds shall be used to construct or retrofit existing facilities used as public 35 36 hurricane shelters. Each year the division shall prioritize the use of these funds for projects included in the annual report of 37 38 the Shelter Development Retrofit Report prepared in accordance 39 with s. 252.385(3). The division must give funding priority to projects in regional planning council regions that have shelter 40 41 deficits and to projects that maximize the use of state funds.

42 (2)(a) Forty percent of the total appropriation in
43 paragraph (1)(a) shall be used to inspect and improve tie-downs
44 for mobile homes.

(b)1. The Manufactured Housing and Mobile Home Mitigation and Enhancement Program is established. The program shall require the mitigation of damage to or the enhancement of homes for the areas of concern raised by the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles in the 2004-2005 Hurricane Reports on the effects of the 2004 and 2005 hurricanes on manufactured and

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51 mobile homes in this state. The mitigation or enhancement must 52 include, but need not be limited to, problems associated with 53 weakened trusses, studs, and other structural components caused 54 by wood rot or termite damage; site-built additions; or tie-down 55 systems and may also address any other issues deemed appropriate 56 by the Gulf Coast State College Tallahassee Community College, 57 the Federation of Manufactured Home Owners of Florida, Inc., the 58 Florida Manufactured Housing Association, and the Department of 59 Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles. The program shall include an education and outreach component to ensure that owners of 60 61 manufactured and mobile homes are aware of the benefits of 62 participation.

63 2. The program shall be a grant program that ensures that 64 entire manufactured home communities and mobile home parks may 65 be improved wherever practicable. The moneys appropriated for 66 this program shall be distributed directly to <u>the Gulf Coast</u> 67 <u>State College Tallahassee Community College</u> for the uses set 68 forth under this subsection.

G9 3. Upon evidence of completion of the program, the Citizens Property Insurance Corporation shall grant, on a pro rata basis, actuarially reasonable discounts, credits, or other rate differentials or appropriate reductions in deductibles for the properties of owners of manufactured homes or mobile homes on which fixtures or construction techniques that have been demonstrated to reduce the amount of loss in a windstorm have

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76 been installed or implemented. The discount on the premium must 77 be applied to subsequent renewal premium amounts. Premiums of 78 the Citizens Property Insurance Corporation must reflect the 79 location of the home and the fact that the home has been 80 installed in compliance with building codes adopted after 81 Hurricane Andrew. Rates resulting from the completion of the 82 Manufactured Housing and Mobile Home Mitigation and Enhancement 83 Program are not considered competitive rates for the purposes of 84 s. 627.351(6)(d)1. and 2.

85 4. On or before January 1 of each year, the Gulf Coast 86 State College Tallahassee Community College shall provide a report of activities under this subsection to the Governor, the 87 88 President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of 89 Representatives. The report must set forth the number of homes that have taken advantage of the program, the types of 90 91 enhancements and improvements made to the manufactured or mobile 92 homes and attachments to such homes, and whether there has been 93 an increase in availability of insurance products to owners of 94 manufactured or mobile homes.

96 The Gulf Coast State College Tallahassee Community College shall 97 develop the programs set forth in this subsection in 98 consultation with the Federation of Manufactured Home Owners of 99 Florida, Inc., the Florida Manufactured Housing Association, and 100 the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles. The moneys

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101	appropriated for the programs set forth in this subsection shall
102	be distributed directly to <u>the Gulf Coast State College</u>
103	Tallahassee Community College to be used as set forth in this
104	subsection.
105	(7) This section is repealed June 30, 2032 2022 .
106	Section 2. Effective July 1, 2022, all powers, duties,
107	functions, records, property, pending issues, and unexpended
108	balances of appropriations, allocations, and other funds in
109	Tallahassee Community College related to the programs authorized
110	under s. 215.559(2), Florida Statutes, are transferred to the
111	Gulf Coast State College.
112	Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2022.

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
