For the IEP in effect at the beginning of the school year the student is expected to graduate, the statement must 65 66 include a signed statement by the parent, the guardian, or the student, if the student has reached the age of majority and 67 68 rights have transferred to the student, that he or she 69 understands the process for deferment and identifying if the 70 student will defer the receipt of his or her standard high 71 school diploma.

(b) A statement of intent to receive a standard high school diploma before the student attains the age of 22 and a description of how the student will fully meet the requirements in s. 1003.4282, including, but not limited to, a portfolio

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76 pursuant to <u>s. 1003.4282(10)(b)</u> s. 1003.4282(9)(b) which meets 77 the criteria specified in State Board of Education rule. The IEP 78 must also specify the outcomes and additional benefits expected 79 by the parent and the IEP team at the time of the student's 80 graduation.
