Remove lines 19-35 and insert:

7 (b) A district school board or Florida College System
 8 institution board of trustees, in consultation with regional
 9 workforce and economic development organizations, may implement
 10 a plan for a differential out-of-state fee for the purpose of
 11 recruiting students into programs of study identified as
 12 necessary to address unmet current and future workforce needs in
 13 the region as identified by the Labor Market Estimating
 14 Conference created in s. 216.136 or the Credentials Review
 15 Committee established in s. 445.004. A school district or
 16 Florida College System institution shall prioritize the

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17 enrollment of a resident student into the identified programs of
18 study over an out-of-state student. A district school board or
19 Florida College System institution board of trustees shall
20 annually provide a report to the State Board of Education on the
21 employment outcomes of the students who receive a differential
22 out-of-state fee. The report must include the percentage of such
23 students who are employed in the occupations identified as
24 having unmet current and future workforce needs.

25 Section 2. Paragraph (b) of subsection (6) of section
26 1009.23, Florida Statutes, is redesignated as paragraph (c) and
27 a new paragraph (b) is added to that subsection, to read:

28 1009.23 Florida College System institution student fees.—

30 (b) A Florida College System institution board of
31 trustees, in consultation with regional workforce and economic
32 development organizations, may implement a plan for a
33 differential out-of-state fee for the purpose of recruiting
34 students into programs of study identified as necessary to
35 address unmet current and future workforce needs in the region
36 as identified by the Labor Market Estimating Conference created
37 in s. 216.136 or the Credentials Review Committee established in
38 s. 445.004. A Florida College System institution shall
39 prioritize the enrollment of a resident student into the
40 identified programs of study over an out-of-state student. A
