Except as otherwise provided in s. 466.024, only 137 (1)138 dental hygienists may be delegated the task of removing calculus 139 deposits and τ accretions τ and stains from exposed surfaces of 140 the teeth and from tooth surfaces within the gingival sulcus and 141 the task of performing root planing and gingival curettage. In addition, dental hygienists may expose dental X-ray films, apply 142 143 topical preventive or prophylactic agents, and perform all tasks 144 delegable by the dentist in accordance with s. 466.024. The 145 board by rule shall determine whether such functions shall be 146 performed under the direct, indirect, or general supervision of 147 the dentist.
