19	(1) <u>A</u> An employee complaint alleging a <u>business entity's</u> ,
20	a governmental entity's, or an educational institution's private

23	practices, and all information relating to an investigation of
24	such complaint, held by the <u>Department of Health or the</u>

39 active, information in records relating to the investigation 40 remains confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), 41 Art. I of the State Constitution if disclosure of that 42 information would do any of the following:

43 (a) Jeopardize the integrity of another active44 investigation.

45 (b) Reveal medical information about an <u>individual</u>
46 employee.

47 (c) Reveal information regarding an <u>individual's</u>
48 employee's religious beliefs.

(3) Information made confidential and exempt under this
section may be released to another <u>business entity</u>, governmental

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51 entity, or educational institution in the furtherance of that 52 entity's or institution's lawful duties and responsibilities. 53 (4) This section does not prohibit the disclosure of 54 information in an aggregated format. 55 This section is subject to the Open Government Sunset (5) Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand repealed 56 57 on October 2, 2028, unless reviewed and saved from repeal 58 through reenactment by the Legislature This section shall stand 59 repealed on October 2, 2023. 60 Section 2. The Legislature finds that it is a public 61 necessity that a complaint alleging a business entity's, a governmental entity's, or an educational institution's violation 62 of s. 381.00316, Florida Statutes, or s. 381.00319, Florida 63 64 Statutes, and all information relating to an investigation of 65 such complaint, held by the Department of Health or the 66 Department of Legal Affairs be made exempt from s. 119.07(1), 67 Florida Statutes, and s. 24(a), Article I of the State 68 Constitution. Protection of such information is required to 69 safeguard an individual's private information regarding medical 70 information or religious beliefs and to ensure the integrity of an active investigation, if applicable. 71 72 Section 3. This act shall take effect on the same date 73 that HB 1013 or similar legislation takes effect, if such 74 legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an 75 extension thereof and becomes a law.
