- 5. Has notified the department in writing of its decision to apply for the grant no later than September 1, 2023.
- 6. Except for s. 1009.89(1) and (3), complies with all other requirements provided in s. 1009.89.
- (b) The department shall issue a grant pursuant to s.

 1009.89 to any full-time, degree-seeking undergraduate student
 who is registered at an independent for-profit college or
 university that meets all of the following criteria:
- 1. Has a level 6 accreditation from the Southern
 Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges.
 - 2. Is located in and charted by the state.
- 3. Was licensed by the department on or before October 1, 2021.
- 4. Has a secular purpose. The receipt of state aid by students at the college or university may not have the primary effect of advancing or impeding religion, or result in an
