10 Section 2. Paragraph (b) of subsection (3) and subsection  
11 (5) of section 937.022, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

12 937.022 Missing Endangered Persons Information  
13 Clearinghouse.—

14 (3) The clearinghouse shall:

15 (b) Provide a centralized file for the exchange of  
16 information on missing endangered persons.

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17           1. Every state, county, or municipal law enforcement  
18 agency shall submit to the clearinghouse information concerning  
19 missing endangered persons.

20           2. Any person having knowledge may submit a missing  
21 endangered person report to the clearinghouse concerning a child  
22 or adult younger than 26 years of age whose whereabouts is  
23 unknown, regardless of the circumstances, subsequent to  
24 reporting such child or adult missing to the appropriate law  
25 enforcement agency within the county in which the child or adult  
26 became missing, and subsequent to entry by the law enforcement  
27 agency of the child or person into the Florida Crime Information  
28 Center, ~~and~~ the National Crime Information Center, and the  
29 National Missing and Unidentified Persons System databases. The  
30 missing endangered person report shall be included in the  
31 clearinghouse database.

32           3. Only the law enforcement agency having jurisdiction  
33 over the case may submit a missing endangered person report to  
34 the clearinghouse involving a missing adult age 26 years or  
35 older who is suspected by a law enforcement agency of being  
36 endangered or the victim of criminal activity.

37           4. Only the law enforcement agency having jurisdiction  
38 over the case may make a request to the clearinghouse for the  
39 activation of a state Silver Alert or a Purple Alert involving a  
40 missing adult if circumstances regarding the disappearance have

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41 met the criteria for activation of the Silver Alert Plan or the  
42 Purple Alert.

43 (5) The law enforcement agency having jurisdiction over a  
44 case involving a missing endangered person shall, upon locating  
45 the child or adult, immediately purge information about the case  
46 from the Florida Crime Information Center, ~~or~~ the National Crime  
47 Information Center, and the National Missing and Unidentified  
48 Persons System databases and notify the clearinghouse.

49 Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2023.
