6 Between lines 62 and 63, insert:

7 Section 3. Paragraphs (a) and (b) of subsection (16) of  
 8 section 633.202, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

9 633.202 Florida Fire Prevention Code.—

10 (16) (a) As used in this subsection, the term:

11 1. "Agricultural pole barn" means a nonresidential farm  
 12 building in which 70 percent or more of the perimeter walls are  
 13 permanently open and allow free ingress and egress.

14 2. "Nonresidential farm building" has the same meaning as  
 15 provided in s. 604.50.

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16           3. "Drone port" has the same meaning as provided in s.  
17 330.41(2) (d) .

18           (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law:

19           1. A nonresidential farm building in which the occupancy  
20 is limited by the property owner to no more than 35 persons is  
21 exempt from the Florida Fire Prevention Code, including the  
22 national codes and Life Safety Code incorporated by reference.

23           2. An agricultural pole barn is exempt from the Florida  
24 Fire Prevention Code, including the national codes and the Life  
25 Safety Code incorporated by reference.

26           3. Except for an agricultural pole barn, a structure on a  
27 farm, as defined in s. 823.14(3) (c), which is used by an owner  
28 for agritourism activity, as defined in s. 570.86, for which the  
29 owner receives consideration must be classified in one of the  
30 following classes:

31           a. Class 1: A nonresidential farm building that is used by  
32 the owner 12 or fewer times per year for agritourism activity  
33 with up to 100 persons occupying the structure at one time. A  
34 structure in this class is subject to annual inspection for  
35 classification by the local authority having jurisdiction. This  
36 class is not subject to the Florida Fire Prevention Code but is  
37 subject to rules adopted by the State Fire Marshal pursuant to  
38 this section.

39           b. Class 2: A nonresidential farm building that is used by  
40 the owner for agritourism activity with up to 300 persons

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41 occupying the structure at one time. A structure in this class  
42 is subject to annual inspection for classification by the local  
43 authority having jurisdiction. This class is not subject to the  
44 Florida Fire Prevention Code but is subject to rules adopted by  
45 the State Fire Marshal pursuant to this section.

46 c. Class 3: A structure or facility that is used primarily  
47 for housing, sheltering, or otherwise accommodating members of  
48 the general public. A structure or facility in this class is  
49 subject to annual inspection for classification by the local  
50 authority having jurisdiction. This class is subject to the  
51 Florida Fire Prevention Code.

52 4. A drone port is exempt from the Florida Fire Prevention  
53 Code, including national codes and the Life Safety Code  
54 incorporated by reference.
