Remove lines 29-84 and insert:

7 scores of students.-A value of 0.16 full-time equivalent student 8 membership shall be calculated for each student enrolled in an 9 International Baccalaureate course who receives a score of 4 or 10 higher, or the equivalent as determined by the Department of Education, on a subject examination. 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17 80 percent of the funds received from International 18 Baccalaureate bonus FTE funding to the school program whose 19 students generate the funds and to school programs that prepare prospective students to enroll in International Baccalaureate 20 courses. Funds shall be expended solely for the payment of 21 22 allowable costs associated with the International Baccalaureate 23 program. Allowable costs include International Baccalaureate 24 annual school fees; International Baccalaureate examination 25 fees; salary, benefits, and bonuses for teachers and program 26 coordinators for the International Baccalaureate program and 27 teachers and coordinators who prepare prospective students for the International Baccalaureate program; supplemental books; 28 29 instructional supplies; instructional equipment or instructional 30 materials for International Baccalaureate courses; other 31 activities that identify prospective International Baccalaureate 32 students or prepare prospective students to enroll in International Baccalaureate courses; and training or 33 34 professional development for International Baccalaureate 35 teachers. School districts shall allocate the remaining 20 36 percent of the funds received from International Baccalaureate 37 bonus FTE funding for programs that assist academically 38 disadvantaged students to prepare for more rigorous courses. The 39 school district shall distribute to each classroom teacher who 40 provided International Baccalaureate instruction:

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A bonus in the amount of \$50 for each student taught by
the International Baccalaureate teacher in each International
Baccalaureate course who receives a score of 4 or higher, or the
<u>equivalent as determined by the department</u>, on the International
Baccalaureate examination.

An additional bonus of \$500 to each International Baccalaureate teacher in a school designated with a grade of "D" or "F" who has at least one student scoring 4 or higher, or the equivalent as determined by the department, on the International Baccalaureate examination, regardless of the number of classes taught or of the number of students scoring a 4 or higher <u>or the</u> equivalent, on the International Baccalaureate examination.

54 Bonuses awarded under this paragraph shall be in addition to any 55 regular wage or other bonus the teacher received or is scheduled 56 to receive. For such courses, the teacher shall earn an 57 additional bonus of \$50 for each student who has a qualifying 58 score.
