House Memorial

A memorial to the President and Congress of the United States, urging the President and Congress to take action to adjust regulatory policy as necessary to allow states the ability to conduct feasibility studies on reclamation and repurposing of spent nuclear fuel for new nuclear energy generation.

WHEREAS, nuclear reprocessing technology has been used extensively throughout Europe, Russia, and Japan, and

WHEREAS, existing reprocessing technology has resulted in a gain of approximately 30 percent more energy than the initial uranium source, and

WHEREAS, the United States has conducted more than 250 plant-years of reprocessing technology operations, and

WHEREAS, reprocessing technology results in more rapid decay and reduces the volume of high-level nuclear waste to nearly one-fifth, and

WHEREAS, fourth generation fast neutron reactors will significantly expand the opportunity for reprocessing technology to include previously underused stockpiles of depleted uranium, and

WHEREAS, the use of depleted uranium in reprocessing technology potentially amounts to over 1.2 million tons of

underused uranium stockpiles, which significantly reduces the prevalence of uranium mining, and

WHEREAS, nuclear fuel is a green energy that supports the carbon-free power demand, and

WHEREAS, four nuclear reactors located at two power plants in the state generate more than 3,000 megawatts, powering nearly 1.9 million homes with clean energy, and

WHEREAS, federal government regulation and policy changes have resulted in the closure of all three civil reprocessing plants in the United States, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

That the President and Congress of the United States are urged to take action to adjust regulatory policy as necessary to allow states the ability to conduct feasibility studies on reclamation and repurposing of spent nuclear fuel for new nuclear energy generation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of State dispatch copies of this memorial to the President of the United States, the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, and each member of the Florida delegation to the United States Congress.
