21	provisional license or registration may not be issued unless the

(b) Has made adequate provisions for the health and safety 37 38 of the child. 39 (c)1. Has a valid certificate issued by the United States Department of Defense to provide child care; or 40 41 2. Provides evidence that he or she has, within the 42 previous 12 months: 43 a.
