7 (1) (a) A local law enforcement agency may develop and  
8 maintain a database, to be known as a "Persons with Disabilities  
9 Registry," listing persons who have developmental,  
10 psychological, or other disabilities or conditions that may be  
11 relevant to their interactions with law enforcement officers.  
12 Persons with any type of confirmed developmental, psychological,  
13 or other disability or condition, including, but not limited to,  
14 autism spectrum disorder, Alzheimer's disease or a dementia-  
15 related disorder, or Down syndrome, may be enrolled in a  
16 registry.

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17 (b) An adult with a disability or condition may enroll  
18 himself or herself in a registry. If a person with a disability  
19 has been declared incapacitated under chapter 744, a parent or  
20 legal guardian of the person may enroll him or her in a  
21 registry. An incapacitated adult enrolled by another person must  
22 be notified of that enrollment by the local law enforcement  
23 agency in writing at his or her address of record within 5  
24 business days after enrollment in a registry.

25 (c) A minor with a disability or condition may be enrolled  
26 in a registry by his or her parent or legal guardian. A minor  
27 who was enrolled by another person must be notified by the local  
28 law enforcement agency in writing of that enrollment at his or  
29 her address of record within 5 business days after his or her  
30 18th birthday.

31 (d) At the time of registration, proof of eligibility for  
32 enrollment in a registry must be submitted to the local law  
33 enforcement agency. The local law enforcement agency may accept  
34 any of the following documents for the requisite proof of  
35 eligibility:

36 1. Certification of the disability or condition from a:

37 a. Physician or physician assistant licensed under chapter  
38 458 or chapter 459 or an advanced practice registered nurse  
39 licensed under chapter 464; or

40 b. Psychologist licensed under chapter 490, a mental  
41 health counselor licensed under chapter 491, or a psychiatrist

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42 as defined in s. 394.455(37) if the registration is based on  
43 psychological conditions.

44 2. Documentation of the legal authority for a parent or  
45 legal guardian to enroll a child or ward, which may include, but  
46 need not be limited to, proof of parentage or guardianship, as  
47 applicable:

48 a. A birth certificate as described in s. 382.013;

49 b. A power of attorney, as defined in s. 709.2102(9);

50 c. A court order establishing parental rights or  
51 guardianship; or

52 d. Letters of guardianship as described in s. 744.345.

53 (e) A registration is valid until the person is removed  
54 from the registry. A minor or an incapacitated adult may be  
55 removed from a registry by the minor's parent or legal guardian  
56 or the adult's legal guardian, respectively. A competent person  
57 who has reached 18 years of age may also choose to have his or  
58 her name removed from a registry. Upon a valid verbal or written  
59 request for removal of a person from a registry, the local law  
60 enforcement agency must remove the person's information from the  
61 registry within 5 business days after the request is made.

62 (2) A registry may include, but need not be limited to,  
63 any of the following information:

64 (a) The listed person's name, contact information,  
65 personal identifying information, and disability or condition

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66 that may be relevant to interactions with law enforcement  
67 officers.

68 (b) If a person did not enroll himself or herself, the  
69 name, contact information, and personal identifying information  
70 of the person who enrolled the listed person in the registry.

71 (c) Any additional information provided by the enrollee or  
72 the person who enrolled the listed person in the registry,  
73 including the certification of the condition or disability.

74 (3) A local law enforcement agency may provide relevant  
75 information from a registry to a law enforcement officer engaged  
76 in his or her official duties.
