6 7 Remove everything after the enacting clause and insert: Section 1. Section 403.0674, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

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403.0674 Biosolids grant program.—A biosolids grant program is established within the department.

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(1) Subject to the appropriation of funds by the Legislature, the department may provide grants to counties, special districts, and municipalities in this state to support the following projects:

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(a) For the evaluation and implementation of innovative technologies and solutions for the disposal of biosolids; or

- (2) An applicant for a biosolids grant must be a county, special district, or municipal governmental entity; however, applicants are encouraged to form public-private partnerships with private utilities and firms.
- (3) Projects eligible for funding under this section may include, but are not limited to, projects that:
 - (a) Reduce the amount of nutrients in biosolids.
- (b) Reduce the amount of emerging contaminants in biosolids.
- (c) Provide alternatives to the land application or landfilling of biosolids as a method of disposal.
- (4) In allocating grant funds, the department shall prioritize projects by considering the environmental benefit that a project may provide. To evaluate the environmental benefit of a project, the department shall review an analysis of how the project's conversion to Class AA biosolids, non-fertilizer uses or disposal methods, alternatives to synthetic fertilizers derived from wastewater residuals, or innovative technologies are projected to minimize the impact of nutrients and other pollutants on water quality and the environment.
- (5) The department shall administer the grant program so
