11 of the case or that the totality of the circumstances, including 12 the preservation of public safety, warrants an extension, the 13 court may extend the length of secure detention care for up to 14 an additional 21 days if the child is charged with an offense 15 which, if committed by an adult, would be a capital felony, a 16 life felony, a felony of the first degree or the second degree, 17 or a felony of the third degree involving violence against any 18 individual, or any other offense involving the possession or use 19 of a firearm. The court may continue to extend the period of 20 secure detention care in increments of up to 21 days each by 21 conducting a hearing before the expiration of the current period 22 to determine the need for continued secure detention of the 23 child. At the hearing, the court must make the required findings 24 in writing to extend the period of secure detention. If the 25 court extends the time period for secure detention care, it 26 shall ensure an adjudicatory hearing for the case commences as 27 soon as is reasonably possible considering the totality of the 28 circumstances.
