19	Section 1. Section 320.0848, Florida Statutes, is amended
20	to read:
21	320.0848 Persons who have disabilities; issuance of
22	permanent or temporary disabled parking permits; temporary
23	pormits; permits for certain providers of transportation
24	services to persons who have disabilities
25	(1) ISSUANCE OF DISABLED PARKING PERMIT; REQUIREMENTS
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26 The Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles or (a) 27 its authorized agents shall, upon application and receipt of the 28 appropriate fee, issue a permanent disabled parking permit to a for a period of up to 4 years, which period ends on the 29 30 applicant's birthday, to any person who has a long-term mobility impairment, or a temporary disabled parking permit for a period 31 32 of up not to exceed 6 months to a any person who has a temporary mobility impairment. A No person is not will be required to pay 33 34 a fee for a temporary disabled parking permit for disabled persons more than once in a 12-month period from the date of the 35 36 prior fee payment.

(b)1. The person must be currently certified as being legally blind or as having any of the following disabilities that render him or her unable to walk 200 feet without stopping to rest:

a. Inability to walk without the use of or assistance from
a brace, cane, crutch, prosthetic device, or other assistive
device, or without the assistance of another person. If the
assistive device significantly restores the person's ability to
walk to the extent that the person <u>is able to can</u> walk without
severe limitation, the person is not eligible for <u>a disabled the</u>
exemption parking permit.

b. The need to permanently use a wheelchair.

49 c. Restriction by lung disease to the extent that the 50 person's forced (respiratory) expiratory volume for 1 second,

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51 when measured by spirometry, is less than 1 liter, or the 52 person's arterial oxygen is less than 60 mm/hg on room air at 53 rest.

d. Use of portable oxygen.

e. Restriction by cardiac condition to the extent that the
person's functional limitations are classified in severity as
Class III or Class IV according to standards set by the American
Heart Association.

The certificate certification of disability which is required under subparagraph 1. must be provided by a physician 62 licensed under chapter 458, chapter 459, or chapter 460, by a 63 64 podiatric physician licensed under chapter 461, by an 65 optometrist licensed under chapter 463, by an advanced practice 66 registered nurse licensed under chapter 464 under the protocol of a licensed physician as stated in this subparagraph, by a 67 68 physician assistant licensed under chapter 458 or chapter 459, 69 or by a similarly licensed physician from another state if the 70 application is accompanied by documentation of the physician's 71 licensure in the other state and a form signed by the out-of-72 state physician verifying his or her knowledge of this state's 73 eligibility guidelines.

105 The Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles (e) shall, in consultation with the Commission for the 106 107 Transportation Disadvantaged, adopt rules $_{\tau}$  in accordance with chapter  $120_{\tau}$  for the issuance of a disabled parking permit to 108 109 any organization that can adequately demonstrate a bona fide need for such a permit because the organization provides regular 110 111 transportation services to persons who have disabilities and are certified as provided in this subsection. 112

113 (2) <u>PERMANENT</u> DISABLED PARKING PERMIT; PERSONS WITH LONG-114 TERM MOBILITY <u>IMPAIRMENT</u> <del>PROBLEMS</del>.-

115 The permanent disabled parking permit is a placard (a) 116 that can be placed in a motor vehicle so as to be visible from 117 the front and rear of the vehicle. Each side of the placard must 118 have the international symbol of accessibility in a contrasting 119 color in the center so as to be visible. One side of the placard 120 must display the applicant's driver license number or state 121 identification card number along with a warning that the 122 applicant must possess have such identification at all times 123 while using the placard parking permit. However, in those cases 124 in which where the severity of the disability prevents a 125 disabled person from physically visiting or being transported to

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126 a driver license or tax collector's <del>collector</del> office to obtain a 127 driver license or identification card, a certifying physician 128 may sign the exemption section of the department's disabled person parking permit application to exempt the disabled person 129 130 from the requirement that his or her being issued a driver 131 license or identification card for the number to be displayed on 132 the placard parking permit. A validation sticker must also be 133 issued with each disabled parking permit, showing the month and 134 year of expiration on each side of the placard. Validation 135 stickers must be of the size specified by the Department of 136 Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles and must be affixed to the 137 disabled parking permits. The disabled parking permits must use 138 the same colors as license plate validations.

(b) License plates issued under ss. 320.084, 320.0842,
320.0843, and 320.0845 are valid for the same parking privileges
and other privileges provided under ss. 316.1955, 316.1964, and
526.141(5)(a).

(c) The department <u>may shall</u> not issue an additional disabled parking permit unless the applicant states that he or she is a frequent traveler or a quadriplegic. The department may not issue to any one eligible applicant more than two disabled parking permits except to an organization in accordance with paragraph (1)(e). Subsections (1), (5), <u>and</u> (6), <u>and</u> (7) apply to this subsection.

(d) To obtain a replacement for a disabled parking permit

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151 that has been lost or stolen, a person must submit an 152 application on a form prescribed by the department, provide a 153 certificate of disability issued within the last 12 months 154 pursuant to subsection (1), and pay a replacement fee in the 155 amount of \$1, to be retained by the issuing agency. If the 156 person submits with the application a police report documenting 157 that the permit was stolen, there is no replacement fee. A 158 veteran who has been previously evaluated and certified by the 159 United States Department of Veterans Affairs or any branch of 160 the United States Armed Forces as permanently and totally disabled from a service-connected disability may provide a 161 United States Department of Veterans Affairs Form Letter 27-333, 162 or its equivalent, issued within the last 12 months in lieu of a 163 164 certificate of disability.

(e) A person who qualifies for a disabled parking permit under this section may be issued an international wheelchair user symbol license plate under s. 320.0843 in lieu of the disabled parking permit; or, if the person qualifies for a "DV" license plate under s. 320.084, such a license plate may be issued to him or her in lieu of a disabled parking permit.

(3) DISABLED PARKING PERMIT; TEMPORARY.-

(a) The temporary disabled parking permit is a placard of
a different color different from the color of the permanent
long-term disabled parking permit placard, and must clearly
display the date of expiration in large print and with color

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176 coding, but is identical to the permanent long-term disabled 177 parking permit placard in all other respects, including, but not 178 limited to, the inclusion of a state identification card number or driver license number on one side of the placard temporary 179 180 permit. Validation stickers must also be issued with each The temporary disabled parking permit so as placard must be designed 181 182 to conspicuously display the month and year of expiration date of the permit on each side the front and back of the placard. 183 184 Validation stickers must be of the size specified by the 185 department, must use the same colors as license plate validation 186 stickers, and must be affixed to the placard.

(b) The department shall issue the temporary disabled
parking permit for the period of the disability as stated by the
certifying physician, but not to exceed 6 months.

190 (c) The fee for a temporary disabled parking permit is191 \$15.

192 (4) <u>FEE DISTRIBUTION.-</u>From the proceeds of the temporary
 193 disabled parking permit fees:

(a) The Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles
must receive \$3.50 for each temporary permit, to be deposited
into the Highway Safety Operating Trust Fund and used for
implementing the real-time disabled parking permit database and
for administering the disabled parking permit program.

(b) The tax collector, for processing, must receive \$2.50for each temporary permit.

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201 The remainder must be distributed monthly as follows: (C) 202 To be deposited in the Grants and Donations Trust Fund 1. 203 of the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation of the Department 204 of Education for the purpose of improving employment and 205 training opportunities for persons who have disabilities, with 206 special emphasis on removing transportation barriers, \$4. 207 2. To be deposited in the Transportation Disadvantaged 208 Trust Fund to be used for funding matching grants to counties 209 for the purpose of improving transportation of persons who have 210 disabilities, \$5. REQUIRED STATEMENT.-The applications for permanent 211 (5)212 disabled parking permits and temporary disabled parking permits 213 are official state documents. The following statement must 214 appear on each application form immediately below the 215 physician's signature and immediately below the applicant's

216 signature: "Knowingly providing false information on this 217 application is a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as 218 provided in s. 775.082, Florida Statutes, or s. 775.083, Florida 219 Statutes. The penalty is up to 1 year in jail or a fine of 220 \$1,000, or both."

### (6) <u>PENALTIES.</u>

(a) A Any person who knowingly makes a false or misleading statement in an application or certification under this section commits a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.

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226 (b) (7) A Any person who fraudulently obtains or unlawfully 227 displays a disabled parking permit that belongs to another 228 person while occupying a disabled parking space or an access aisle as defined in s. 553.5041 while the permitholder owner of 229 230 the permit is not being transported in the motor vehicle or who 231 uses an unauthorized replica of such a disabled parking permit 232 with the intent to deceive commits is guilty of a misdemeanor of 233 the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 234 775.083.

235 (7) (8) CONFISCATION OF DISABLED PARKING PERMIT.-A law 236 enforcement officer or a parking enforcement specialist may 237 confiscate the disabled parking permit from a any person who 238 fraudulently obtains or unlawfully uses such a permit. A law 239 enforcement officer or a parking enforcement specialist may 240 confiscate a any disabled parking permit that is expired, 241 reported as lost or stolen, or defaced or that does not display 242 a personal identification number.

243 (a) The permit number of each confiscated disabled parking 244 permit must be submitted to the department, and the fact that 245 the disabled parking permit has been confiscated must be noted 246 on the permitholder's record. If two disabled parking permits 247 issued to the same person have been confiscated, the department 248 shall refer the information to the central abuse hotline of the 249 Department of Children and Families for an investigation of potential abuse, neglect, or exploitation of the permitholder 250

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#### 251 permit owner.

252 A confiscated disabled parking permit must be held as (b) 253 evidence until a judicial decision about the violation has been 254 made. After a finding of quilt has been made or a plea of nolo 255 contendere has been entered, the charging agency shall destroy 256 the confiscated disabled parking permit. A confiscated disabled 257 parking permit may not, under any circumstances, be returned to 258 the permitholder its registered owner after a finding of guilt 259 has been made or a plea of nolo contendere has been entered in 260 court. If a finding of guilt has been made or a plea of nolo contendere has been entered for fraudulent or other unlawful use 261 of a disabled parking permit after a prior finding of quilt or 262 plea of nolo contendere for fraudulent or other unlawful use of 263 264 a disabled parking permit issued to the same registered 265 permitholder, the permitholder may not apply for a new disabled 266 parking permit for 4 years. The permit number of each destroyed 267 permit must be reported to the department, and the department 268 must record in the real-time disabled parking permit database 269 that the permit has been invalidated.

<u>(8)</u> (9) <u>REVIEW.</u>

(a) At least once every 6 months, the department shall randomly review disabled parking permitholders to ensure that all required criteria for the ownership and possession of such permit remain valid. As a component of the review, the department shall, at a minimum:

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Review death records maintained by the Department of
 Health to ensure that the permitholder <u>is not deceased</u> has not
 died.

279 2. Review the number of times the permit has been280 confiscated for fraudulent or unlawful use, if at all.

3. Determine <u>whether</u> if the permit has ever been reported
lost or stolen and, if so, determine the current status of the
permit.

(b) At least annually, the department shall verify that the <u>holder</u> <del>owner</del> of each disabled parking permit <u>is not deceased</u> <u>has not died</u>. Such verification shall include, but need not be limited to, consultation of death records maintained by the Department of Health. If a disabled parking permitholder is found to be deceased, the department shall promptly invalidate the decedent's disabled parking permit.

291 <u>(9) (10)</u> <u>REPORTS OF ABUSE.</u>—The department shall develop and 292 implement a means by which persons <u>may</u> <del>can</del> report abuse of 293 disabled parking permits by telephone hotline or by submitting a 294 form online or by mail.

295 <u>(10) (11)</u> <u>FURTHER DISCIPLINARY ACTION.</u> A violation of this 296 section is grounds for disciplinary action under s. 458.331, s. 297 459.015, s. 460.413, s. 461.013, s. 463.016, or s. 464.018, as 298 applicable.

299 Section 2. Section 320.08035, Florida Statutes, is amended 300 to read:

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301 320.08035 Persons who have disabilities; reduced dimension 302 license plate.-The owner or lessee of a motorcycle, moped, or 303 motorized disability access vehicle who resides in this state 304 and qualifies for a permanent disabled parking permit for a 305 person who has a disability under s. 320.0848, upon application 306 and payment of the appropriate license tax and fees under s. 307 320.08(1), must be issued a license plate that has reduced dimensions as provided under s. 320.06(3)(a). The plate must be 308 309 stamped with the international symbol of accessibility after the numeric and alpha serial number of the license plate. The plate 310 311 entitles the person to all privileges afforded by a permanent 312 disabled parking permit issued under s. 320.0848.

(5) A county or municipality, or any agency thereof, may not impose upon any person who is issued a license plate with the international accessibility symbol, under this section, any fee or penalty for parking in any metered or timed parking space except:

 323 <u>parking permit issued under s. 320.0848 in a space designated</u>
 324 for use by persons who have disabilities.

329 (2) In order to be eligible for the motor vehicle license 330 plate described in subsection (1), a person must comply with the 331 following provisions:

The veteran must offer, in addition to the proof 332 (b) required by s. 320.084(1), proof that due to a service-connected 333 334 disability he or she permanently uses a wheelchair or proof, in 335 the form of an application that conforms to the requirements set 336 forth in s. 320.0848, that he or she qualifies for a permanent 337 disabled parking permit under that section. The license plate 338 entitles the person to all privileges afforded by a permanent 339 disabled parking permit issued under s. 320.0848.

340 Section 5. Subsection (1) of section 320.0843, Florida 341 Statutes, is amended to read:

342 320.0843 License plates for persons with disabilities
343 eligible for permanent disabled parking permits.-

(1) Any owner or lessee of a motor vehicle who resides in this state and qualifies for a <u>permanent</u> disabled parking permit under s. 320.0848(2), upon application to the department and payment of the license tax for a motor vehicle registered under s. 320.08(2), (3)(a), (b), (c), or (e), (4)(a) or (b), (6)(a), or (9)(c) or (d), shall be issued a license plate as provided by s. 320.06 which, in lieu of the serial number prescribed by s.

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351 320.06, shall be stamped with the international wheelchair user 352 symbol after the serial number of the license plate. The license 353 plate entitles the person to all privileges afforded by a 354 <u>permanent disabled</u> parking permit issued under s. 320.0848. When 355 more than one registrant is listed on the registration issued 356 under this section, the eligible applicant shall be noted on the 357 registration certificate.
